Greetings from Mrs. Heenan!

Welcome to the 2023-2024 school year! It has been an outstanding start to the school year, with children settling into school quickly, reuniting with friends, building new friendships, and continuing their learning.

Our (SEL) Social Emotional Learning program kicked off into high gear in elementary school, which made us do a lot of thinking. Each student worked on an "All About Me" project and a "What I did over the Summer" activity. In Middle School, we completed a questionnaire that asked the students a bunch of questions about how they see the world around them. It opened up a great discussion, and were shocked to hear how their teachers would have answered the questions when they were a student! The questionnaire asked about favorite things, famous people, what is popular, about friends, class, and what items cost. My hope is that when they are adults they take a look back at this and smile!

In grades Preschool - Grade 5, we will continue to use the Zones of Regulation Curriculum and add to our SEL binder new and thought-provoking activities. "Zones of Regulation is an approach used to support the development of self-regulation in children. All the different ways children feel, and the states of alertness they experience, are categorized into four colored zones. Grades 6, 7, and 8 will be working on mindfulness-guided journaling. They were each gifted a journal through a donation. The students in Grade 7 received a copy of The Big Life Journal for Kids. These journals are kept private unless they want to share their thoughts after completing a lesson. The children have been adapting well to our school routines and come in each day ready to learn through all the playing we do! It is evident that they are growing in their awareness of others around them, in their own self-help skills, and in their independence in the classroom setting. What a gift as teachers it is to see them helping classmates, taking turns, and praising God through songs and activities!

Fall is quite the reminder for Preschoolers to learn about God's beauty in creation, through the changing colors of the leaves; the life cycle of the apple, from seed to tree to blossom to apple; the changes in temperature from chilly mornings and nights, to warm days while we are outside playing; and to noticing how squirrels begin to store away their food for winter. Children are also reminded often of how much God loves them and has created them in such beautiful, unique ways.

We spend much of our time identifying colors and shapes in our environments (both indoors and out!), and we hunt for letters and numbers in our class throughout the day and in engaging Circle Time activities. A big hit this first month of school has been our housekeeping Dramatic Play area, where you can find children building a home office, caring for the baby dolls, washing and ironing the laundry, and cooking dinner!

As our seasons change, we look forward to seeing how our Preschoolers change and grow, as God works in their young hearts and in our classroom family.

Kindergarten Update from Mrs. Coombs:

Welcome Kindergarten families! Your little ones are o"fish"ally in Kindergarten now. The transition from Preschool to Kindergarten can often be a challenge, but we have found ways to incorporate fun with learning to keep everyone engaged throughout each day. We have taken time to go over classroom expectations and classroom routines in the past month. The students have enjoyed being able to play in our Kindergarten classroom and have found little ways to make the room truly their own. We have been enjoying the beautiful fall weather God has given and have maximized every opportunity to play and learn outside.



Kindergarten jumped right into Science this term. We are studying the oceans, and learned a short song to help us remember the five oceans of the world. Ask your child to sing you the song! We have also taken a deep dive into the zones of the ocean and even created them in a glass jar so they could visually see the layers. We will continue to look at each zone more closely and learn about the different animals that live in each one. We learned about tide pools last week and the students loved exploring the pool we created together in the classroom. Best of all, we will end our Science unit by taking a field trip to Mystic Aquarium on Tuesday, October 31st. We can't wait!

Mmmmmm, the smell of apples filled the air as we made homemade applesauce in the classroom. We learned about the life cycle of the apple tree and the parts of the apple. We even joined together with First and Second Grade to determine which color apple Team A liked the best; red or green. The hands down winner was....insert drum roll... RED! We ended our apple unit with our own little "applefest" by watching a video on one of our friends from the past, Johnny Appleseed. The students enjoyed all the apple fun they experienced that day!

Kindergarten has started working on letter sounds as well as how to form lowercase letters. Each week a packet is sent home with information about the current lowercase letters and letter sounds that we are learning that week. This is a great opportunity for your child to show you what they are learning in class and have you assist them in practicing their sounds and letters.

Ms Rose and I are blessed to see each child grow in their own way as the students have begun to settle into a Kindergarten routine and we look forward to seeing what the year holds for our students! God bless!

Grade 1 Update from Mrs. Shand:

First grade has been off to a strong start! We have been getting to know each other, mastering routines both inside and outside of the classroom, and keeping our HCA rules close to our heart. Most of all, the love of learning has been contagious and has set a wonderful tone for our first grade year!

Students have reviewed and studied the books of the Bible and listened to stories from Creation-Moses. Students have practiced their sounds, letter formation, and learned our test-taking routine in FUNdations. We have also taken our first unit test in Math, focusing on addition and subtraction strategies. In Social Studies, we have kicked off by learning about our continents and oceans. We have also "put ourselves on the map" by finding our continent, country, state, and our very own town! Our little historians have also started a list of "Friends from the Past" where we look at important people that have impacted our world like Johnny Appleseed and Laura Ingalls Wilder. We have been enjoying learning about our ocean & ocean animals more closely in Science. We are very excited for our trip to the aquarium soon.

Coming up next! Students will be using The Beginner's Bible to look at stories from Joshua to Ruth. In FUNdations, we will blend and segment sounds within a word, learn "trick" words, and understand the structure of sentences. In Math, students will continue to explain strategies they use to solve addition/subtraction problems and understand fluency when solving these types of problems. Our next set of "Friends from the Past" will be Andrew Carnegie and PT Barnum. In Science, we will continue our study but dig deeper (literally-the deep ocean!). In Food For Life, we will continue to learn about healthy options for food intake and how to take care of our bodies physically. I am excited to see these students continue to flourish!

Grade 2 Update from Mrs. McGrail:

Greetings from second grade! Second graders have been transitioning into their new classroom, adapting to the new schedule, and understanding the meaning of leadership in their new roles as the "Team A Leaders." In the Bible, we have been working on memorizing the 39 books of the Old Testament. Our class thoroughly enjoyed the Jesus StoryBook Bible stories of the birth, journey and life of Moses, and the warrior leader Joshua. We are currently creating a special book for our Peacebuilders Pledge (can't wait to share with the school and families!). For the second half of the term, we will be digging into stories about fearless leaders such as Deborah, the story of strength of Samson, as well as Ruth, Samuel, and Saul.

In Math we have completed our Unit 1 test, and are making progress in completing Unit 2 in the next week or so. Our pause from Unit 2 to focus on number writing and double facts has been very beneficial. We are rapping doubles, using flashcards, and taking timed doubles pop-quizzes. Once we are past double fact mastery and completion of Unit 2, we will move on to Units 3 and 4 which will focus on addition to 100 strategies as well as fluently adding within 100.

FUNdations Unit 2 will wrap up this week and the remainder of Term 1 will have units 3 and 4 which will focus on closed syllable exceptions and suffixes. Second graders have enjoyed seeing Mrs. Lucier on Tuesdays and Thursdays when she joins us- they even blessed her for her birthday last week by making her beautiful cards and singing Happy Birthday when she walked in!

For the remainder of the term in History and Science, we continue learning about Friends of the Past as well as continuing our learning of the layers of the oceans and volcanoes.

We have lots of fun to look forward to this year- including our first field trip to Mystic Aquarium on 10/31! It's going to be a great year. ©






A NOTE FROM MRS. VELARDE:

Proverbs 5:1-2 says "Pay attention to wisdom; listen carefully to wise counsel. Then you will show discernment, and your lips will express what you've learned." The lips of the 4th grade students have been busy expressing what they've learned so far this term. They have brought energy, excitement for learning, and a hunger for the Lord. Over the past month, the students have settled into 4th grade routines which include the economy system, the encouragement of more independence, and practicing self-advocating. We began the year by setting goals for ourselves and choosing Bible verses to help encourage us as we strive to meet them. Each student has one word that they are using as their guide for this academic year.

In Bible, we have recapped the Pentateuch and have begun the story of Joshua. As we discuss each story, the students have been coming up with "God Sightings". We are keeping them on a bulletin board in the classroom to remind us of who God is and what He has done. So far, we have discussed God's love for us, His protection, faithfulness, patience, creativity, and power. It has been a true joy to see their eagerness to learn more about who God is and what the Bible says about Him.



In History, we have picked up right where we left off last year – the end of the Civil War and how America in the 1860's and 1870's began to pick up the pieces and rebuild the Nation. In Science, we are learning about God as creator as we explore the depths of the oceans and the creatures and plant life He created to live way down there. In Math, we are reviewing material from last year while adding new skills to their prior knowledge. In LA, we are cruising through Shurley Grammar, reading literature while sipping tea and beginning our NaNoWriMo journey. So far, the students have begun brainstorming topics they would like to write about in their novels, and getting ready to "meet" their characters. As we move forward, we will continue to seek God's attributes throughout the Old Testament, increase our intrigue in the industrialization and urbanization of America, dive deeper into the ocean, master multiplication, classify more sentences, create characters and build worlds, and grow in love and understanding for each other. I am so excited to have the opportunity to reconnect with this group of students who were my first class at HCA when I taught 1st grade. We are off to a wonderful start and I can't wait to see where the Lord leads us this year!

Middle School News!

Students have started their fifth grade year with an attitude of curiosity and a strong desire to understand God's Word. We are currently reading through Genesis. Students love to "popcorn" read, where one student reads a few verses and picks another student to continue. Our fifth graders ask interesting and sometimes hard questions. Mrs. Gordon's Musings:

Spiritual Development: The adventure has begun! The start of the 8th grade year is unique in that it clearly marks the beginning of the end of our students' time at HCA. Devotions in our homeroom has been a sweet time together each morning. We are currently nearing the end of the *Jesus Storybook Bible* which provides a beautiful overview of the big story in Scripture. Spiritual Emphasis Week is around the corner (10/16-20), and I am excited to see all that God has for us during that time. The following week 8th grade students will have the opportunity to participate in a Leadership Conference on 10/24. In that space, we will reflect on the gifts and experiences God has provided them with as a group, and brainstorm how those can become a blessing to our student community.

Health: 7th and 8th grade students have weekly Health homework that aims to incorporate movement, good nutrition, and stress-reduction into their regular rhythms of life. Please support your students and engage them in conversation as they consider possible changes in these areas!

Science: 5th and 6th grade are wrapping up their first unit of the year which included introducing science (as opposed to nonscience, pseudoscience, and protoscience), Nature Journaling, and the scientific method. They will now begin their studies of Earth Science starting with our place in space. 7th and 8th grade have thought through some big and challenging questions related to the origin of the universe and life. I highly recommend checking out this resource if you too are interested in these things: Beyond the Evolution vs. Creation Debate. Now they will carry on to a yearlong study of Biology starting, of course, with the incredible cell!
