PRINCIPAL'S CORNER

As we near the end of the school year, I cannot help but glance back and wonder where it has gone! We have created memories with special people during the year while participating in both everyday activities and planned special events. It has been our goal that joyful memories and learning experiences would overlap! Even more so, it is our heart's desire at HCA that our experiences would draw us into a deeper trust relationship with God. Looking back, this has been a year of transition in so many ways. Although Covid is still in our midst, we were able to move back into many of the freedoms we enjoyed prepandemic. In school, this meant that we threw out the pool noodles for measuring six feet of separation and thought in terms of three foot markers. Students began playing together in earnest and working in cooperative groups again. Once we made masks optional, children began talking again too! We brought parents and guests back into the building for wonderful events like China Golden Day, the Veteran's Day program, the Christmas Shoppe, and Africa Day. We re-started a long dormant Parent Teacher Council - a valuable group that has offered feedback and

served the school community well this year!

The Parent Teacher Council even initiated some new ideas like the family field trips, the resurrection egg hunt, and a parent prayer link (available on the website and on page 4 of this Pathways issue). The eighth grade class participated in the ACSI Leadership Conference with Mrs. Gordon and instituted the prayer box for students to share their prayer requests. Students have been prayed with, prayed for, and supported through this God-honoring initiative. Mrs. Lundergan came back to teach theater and library - and lead the school in our first theater production since Covid - Godspell Jr.! Some very important elements of HCA continued as well. We had a meaningful Spiritual Emphasis Week in September and a super fun and successful dog-themed Read-a-thon in January.

The Food for Life program continues to develop at HCA with a garden renovation this year (in progress); Nature Explore updates (to be completed this summer); pedometer fitness challenges; and a field trip to UMass to learn more about permaculture. As our Cultures year draws to a close, I cannot help but think of our how appropriate our concept statements, or big ideas, are for this year in our history. "Cultures evolve, change, and are affected by historical events, politics, socio-economic factors, natural events, contact with other cultures, etc." Our culture is being affected by some intense elements, but participating in activities that are culturally 'normal' this year has had a healing impact on us and our students. God is so good to provide that for us, and it is so perfectly merciful of Him not to ever change Himself regardless of changes in our world. It is hard to believe the school year is almost over! Wow, we have learned a lot in first grade. Even though it is almost time to wrap up this school year, we continue to learn more in our academics and more about the world God created. The country we are studying this term is Brazil. We have learned about the different layers of the rainforest, animals of the rainforest, the weather, and more.

FUNdations has gone by quickly this year. Currently we are on Unit 12 and learning all about syllables and compound words. We are starting the process of how to write a story and become authors. First graders are now experts on the difference between fact writing and opinion writing, as well as how to write a letter. Our next goal is how to write a fiction story.

It has been such a blessing having your student in my class this year. When I think back to our Student Orientation Day, it is amazing to think about how much every student has grown since then. Grade 2 Update from Mrs. McGrail:

Hola! It is SO bittersweet to think we are in the final weeks of the school year- but for now I won't think about it because I will likely cry. So let's instead chat about what we've been up to since Africa Day! Africa Day was a huge success, and our class had a fabulous time sharing the home life, foods, and culture of Kenya. Thank you all for joining us.

Now we have landed in our final destination in our cultures year: The beautiful land of Puerto Rico!

In Social Studies, we have been learning in depth about Puerto Rico's roots in history (from the time of the Taino Indians to Christopher Columbus' arrival, slaves being sent over from Africa and the many events leading to Puerto Rico becoming a territory of the United States.) Our class has been able to watch documentary videos that focus on the kids' perspective of living on the island and their family life. We are currently working through an engaging Puerto Rico workbook that focuses on a child named Luis who lives on the island. This book has been informative, and second graders have been making great connections with their life here in Massachusetts compared to those who live on the island.

For Bible, we have been busy continuing to work through the New Testament section of the Jesus Storybook Bible, never rushing, with focus on taking time to participate in activities and in-depth conversations to strengthen our relationships with God.

FUNdations has been full of fun as we gear up to complete Unit 14 this week. We are on pace to complete all 17 units in the entire FUNdations book! What a HUGE accomplishment!

In Science, we have gone into the very layered land of rainforests- focusing on 4 of the 7 levels of it. FUN FACT: Did you know that Puerto Rico's El Yunque National Forest is the only tropical rainforest in the United States National Forest system? Yes, it's true! What a special gem on the island!

Food for Life has been all about movement, what is happening in our biome in this season, pollinators returning, flowers, power of the sun, and last but not least: the foods of Puerto Rico!
Lastly, in Math we are continuing to wrap up Unit 8 this week, and will close out Unit 9 before we say farewell for the summer.

We will finish our Math curriculum studying the concept of time, and then onto review of this year's topics.



The 4th grade has been quite busy over these past few weeks and we will keep our forward momentum right up to the last week of school! We joined the Middle School and went on a field trip to the UMass Permaculture garden, which gave us new ideas as we prepare to submit ideas for the new design of our school garden. One idea that the students have come up with and proposed is a terrace like those found in Machu Picchu. As part of our studies of Peru, the students have learned about the mysterious and historic site of Machu Picchu which was built without the use of the wheel or other modern technology and is still standing today. We have a field trip coming up on Monday May 16th to the Roger Williams Zoo. This field trip will be a great way to highlight some of the animals from the different biomes we learned about throughout the year. In addition to the field trips, there are many projects taking place in our classroom. We have been learning about missionaries and each student is currently focused on a specific missionary as they do the final book report of the year. The students will build a "mini Peru" to display in the classroom.

Other exciting events coming up are the Art Show and Spring Concert on May 19th and Godspell Jr. on June 7th. The students have been working very hard for both of these performances and I am so excited to see their hard work pay off. The 4th graders has persevered throughout the year and I am very proud of them and their accomplishments. Middle School News!

Fifth Grade Update: Cultural Integration

The Middle School students have had the opportunity to integrate our study of cultures into Math this year. We have calculated and compared the cost of living of each country we have studied and have discovered a sad reality: the average person in the majority of these countries cannot afford a 3-bedroom apartment in the city's center.

In Fifth Grade, Term Four has been full of Guatemalan fun as we have integrated cultures into Food for Life and into our own traditions and celebrations. In Food for Life, we have taken up the 'Move More Challenge' by playing our own version of Ulama and flying kites. We are looking forward to playing more games from Guatemala. We have learned how they celebrate Semana Santa (Holy Week) in Guatemala with alfombras, and adapted it into our Holy Week celebration. We also made Día de la Madre (Mother's Day) cards that represented the loud music and fireworks Guatemalans use at the break of dawn on May 10 to honor their mothers.

At the end of the Term, we are looking forward to spending a little time with next year's fifth graders. We will be sharing what we have learned about Guatemala with the Fourth Graders and learning about the country they are studying in our own Mini Latin America Celebration.

Sixth Grade Update from Mr. Shea:

We are closing in on the end of our school year! Students are wrapping up their year studying Latin American cultures in Central and South America. In Grade Six, we are focusing on the country of Mexico. Students are diving into different aspects of Mexican culture and creating projects and presentations to share with their classmates. Each student pair is working to become an "expert" in one area of Mexican culture with the aim of teaching what they have learned to the rest of their classmates. We will be wrapping up our Cultures year with those presentations.

In Language Arts, we are starting a unit on Filmography. Students will be taking what they've learned about understanding and interpreting literature and applying it to some films that we will be watching in class. The ultimate goal is for students to start using what they've learned in more familiar contexts. I've always seen storytelling as God's primary way of revealing His will to us, and am hoping that through this unit students will start seeing God's story in every story!

As we get to the end of the year, I would love your partnership in keeping students moving through their assignments. In particular, I am thinking of the short story project that we have been working on since the middle of term three. I am pushing students to do their best work, but know that with summer on its way, they will be losing motivation and momentum on their stories (especially with how long we have been focused on this project). Rough drafts of their stories are due ASAP, and the sooner they get them to me the more helpful feedback I can give them.
