They have germinated! We are very excited that the seeds we planted last week have germinated and are peeking above the soil. They are also protected from frost with row cover. Our study of weather in 5th and 6th grade science has been building a nice base for studying biomes. Students have made a few instruments to monitor our own weather. Also, please check the boomerang folders for our recent guiz on atmosphere.

Just a note about quizzes: As you know, studying is a skill that students need to learn as they discover the ways they retain information best. I have been talking with the class about ways they may have noticed they learn. Does it help to make up a song or rhythm? an acronym? draw a picture to go with it? play a game with flashcards? teach the information to someone else? do something active while studying? Most students say they study by reading the information over and over to themselves, hoping they will remember it. This works well for only a small percentage of students. I want to encourage the students to continue to watch for their own learning style so they can help themselves study for quizzes. As parents, you will have the best insight for them since you have been watching them learn since the beginning! I am so glad to be working in partnership with you!

# **Grades 6 - 8 Language Arts**

The silkworms are here! The silkworms are here! (Yes, I know that's odd to hear from me.) I'm excited to have these little critters in my classroom, so that the 6<sup>th</sup> graders and I can share in the silkworm experiment, just like our *Project Mulberry* characters. Hands-on learning really is awesome! We plan to have 2 control groups and determine which foods (mulberry tree leaves or silkworm food) produce the best results. The 7<sup>th</sup> grade class continues to patiently watch as our peppers air dry in the windows of our classroom. Our dehydrated and sun-dried peppers are complete. We have plans to make pepper seasonings when everything is fully dried. In all classes, we are making our way through grammar and loving it. 

As the school year gets underway, I am pleased to announce an excellent math and science project-centered program that WPI will be sponsoring for middle school students.

STEM Saturdays is a Saturday program for girls and boys in the 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grades that will meet six times during the academic year. This half-day STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) program is intended to help students gain an early awareness of the academic possibilities linked to the STEM fields and to teach parents more about these fields and how to support and nurture their children's interests and talents in this area. A parent or guardian or teacher must attend at least 3 of the Saturdays with their student.

Please see the enclosed brochure for more information on program dates and times. The program does have a minimal fee associated with it, but will be offered free to those with demonstrated financial need.
