Dear Kindergarten Parents,

As part of our study of life in America in the 19th-20th century, we will be holding a school wide re-enactment on Friday January 22nd.

Half of the population of the United States attended the Fair during that time and it lasted six months. As a culminating event for term 2 we will be reenacting the *Chicago World's Fair* on Friday January 22nd. To actively participate we are asking that your child pretend to be a person from your own ancestry. Please have your child come dressed as someone from your heritage-where your family has immigrated from. They should know what country they are representing and which side of the family they are representing. Please also send in a dish of food that is special to your family and heritage. This dish of food will be shared with the school and should be labeled with a list of ingredients to protect the children with allergies.

Kindergarten will be 'making' and 'running' the Government Building for that day. We will set up a post office as part of the Government Building and will be selling and mailing postcards to our friends and family. We are looking for things to decorate such as:
