47. What kind of life did Christ live on earth?

A life of perfect obedience to God and His law.

(Matthew 5:17; Romans 10:4; 1 Peter 2:21, 22)

The painful and shameful death of the cross.

(Psalm 22; Isaiah 53; The Gospels—Mathew, Mark, Luke, and John)

Bible Reading:

Proverbs, Gospel of John, and 1 John

Catechism:

22. Who is the Redeemer of God’s elect?

The only Redeemer of God’s elect is the Lord Jesus Christ, who being the eternal Son of God, the 2nd Person of the Trinity, became Man, and so was and continues to be truly God and truly Man, One Divine Person acting through two distinct natures forever.

(Luke 1:35; John 1:14; Romans 9:5; Galatians 4:4; Colossians 2:9; 1 Timothy 2:5-6; Hebrews 7:24-25)

23. How did Christ, being the Son of God, become man?

Christ, the Son of God, became Man by taking to Himself a true human nature, body and soul. He was conceived in the womb of the Virgin Mary by the power of the Holy Spirit, and born of her, yet without sin.

(Matthew 26:38; Luke 1:27, 31, 35, 42; Galatians 4:4; Hebrews 2:14; 4:15; 7:26)

24. What offices does Christ execute as the Redeemer?

Christ, as the Redeemer, executes the offices of a Prophet, Priest, and King.

(Psalm 2:6; Isaiah 9:6-7; Matthew 21:5; Acts 3:21-22; Hebrews 5:5-7; 7:25)

25. How does Christ execute the office of a prophet?

Christ executes the office of a prophet in revealing to His people, by His Word and Spirit, the will of God for their salvation.

(John 1:18; 14:26; 20:31; 1 Peter 1:10-12)
