2. What else did God make?

3. Why did God make you and all things?

For His own glory.

(Psalm 19:1; Jeremiah 9:23, 24; Revelation 4:11; 5:13)

4. How can you glorify God?

By loving Him and doing what He commands.

(Ecclesiastes 12:13; Mark 12:29-31; John 15:8-10; 1 Corinthians 10:31)

Catechism:

7. In how many persons does this one God exist?

In three Persons.

(Matthew 3:16, 17; John 5:23; 10:30; 14:9,10; 15:26; 16:13-15; 1 John 5:20, 2 John 9; Revelation 1:4, 5)

8. Who are these three Persons?

The Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

(Matthew 28:19; 1 Corinthians 8:6; 2 Corinthians 13:14; 1 Peter 1:2; Jude 20, 21)

9. Who is God?

God is a Spirit and does not have a body like men.

(John 4:24; 2 Corinthians 3:17; 1 Timothy 1:17)

10. Where is God?

God is everywhere.

(Psalm 139:7-12; Jeremiah 23:23, 24; Acts 17:27, 28)

11. Can you see God?

No. I cannot see God, but He always sees me.

(Exodus 33:20; John 1:18; 1 Timothy 6:16; Psalm 139, especially verses 1-5; Proverbs 5:21; Hebrews 4:12,13)

30. What do we inherit from Adam as a result of this original sin?

Sin and a sinful nature.

(1 Kings 8:46; Psalm 14:2, 3; 58:3; Ecclesiastes 9:3; Matthew 15:18-20; John 2:24, 25; Romans 8:7)

31. What does every sin and sinner deserve?

The anger and judgment of God.

(Deuteronomy 27:26; Romans 1:18; 2:2; Galatians 3:10; Ephesians 5:6)

32. Can anyone go to Heaven with this sin and sinful nature?

No. Our hearts must be changed before we can be fit for heaven.

(Jeremiah 31:33, 34; Ezekiel 36:25-27; John 1:12, 13; 3:1-10; 1 John 5:1, 4, 18)

33. What is a change of heart called?

Regeneration.

(Titus 3:5-6)

34. Who can change a sinner’s heart?

The Holy Spirit alone.

(John 3:3; Romans 8:6-11; 1 Corinthians 2:9-14; 2 Thessalonians 2:13, 14; Titus 3:5-6)

Catechism:

78. What is the fourth commandment?

The fourth commandment is, “Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy. Six days you shall labor, and do all your work, but the seventh day is a Sabbath to the LORD your God. On it you shall not do any work, you, or your son, or your daughter, your male servant, or your female servant, or your livestock, or the sojourner who is within your gates. For in six days the LORD made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that is in them, and rested on the seventh day. Therefore the LORD blessed the Sabbath day and made it holy.”

(Exodus 20:8-11; 23:12; Deuteronomy 5:12-15)

79. What does the fourth commandment teach us?

To keep the Sabbath holy.

(Leviticus 19:20; 23:3; Isaiah 58:13, 14)

80. What day of the week is the Christian Sabbath?

The first day of the week, called the Lord’s Day.

(Acts 20:7; Revelation 1:10)

81. Why is it called the Lord’s Day?

Because on that day Christ rose from the dead.

(Matthew 28:1; Mark 16:9; Luke 24:1-6; John 20:1)

82. How should the Lord’s Day be kept?

In prayer and praise, in hearing and reading God’s Word, and in doing good to our fellow men and women.

(Isaiah 58:13, 14; Matthew 12:10-13; Luke 4:16; Acts 20:7; 1 Corinthians 16:2)

Catechism:

7. How many persons are there in the Godhead?

There are three persons in the Godhead: The Father, Son, and Holy Spirit; and these three are one God, the same in substance, equal in power and glory.
(Matthew 28:19; John 10:30; Acts 5:3-4; 2 Corinthians 13:14)

8. What are the decrees of God?

The decrees of God are His eternal purpose, according to the counsel of His will, whereby, for His own glory, He has foreordained whatsoever comes to pass.
(Daniel 4:35; Romans 11:36; Ephesians 1:4, 11-12)

9. How does God execute His decrees?

God executes His decrees in the works of creation and providence.
(Ephesians 1:11; Revelation 4:11)

10. What is God’s work of creation?

Creation is God making all things out of nothing, by the word of His power, in the space of six days, and all very good.
(Genesis 1:1-31; Exodus 20:11; Colossians 1:16; Hebrews 11:3)

11. How did God create mankind?

God created man, male and female, after His own image, in knowledge, righteousness and holiness, with dominion over His creatures.
(Genesis 1:26-28; Ecclesiastes 7:29; Ephesians 4:24; Colossians 3:10)
