3. Why did God make you and all things?

For His own glory.

(Psalm 19:1; Jeremiah 9:23, 24; Revelation 4:11; 5:13)

4. How can you glorify God?

By loving Him and doing what He commands.

5. Why should you glorify God?

Catechism:

11. Can you see God?

Yes. Nothing can be hidden from God.

13. Can God do all things?

14. Where do you learn how to love and obey God?

In the Bible alone.

(Job 11:7; Psalm 119:104; Isaiah 8:20; Matthew 22:29; 2 Timothy 3:15-17)

15. Who wrote the Bible?

Holy men who were taught by the Holy Spirit.

(1 Peter 1:20,21; Acts 1:16; 2 Timothy 3:16; 1 Peter 1:10, 11)

16. Who were our first parents?

Adam and Eve.

(Genesis 2:18-25; 3:20; 5:1, 2; Acts 17:26; 1 Timothy 2:13)

Catechism:

44. What is justification?

It is God regarding sinners as if they had never sinned and granting them righteousness.  
(Zechariah 3:1-5; Romans 3:24-26; 4:5; 8:33; 2 Corinthians 5:21; Hebrews 8:12)

45. What is sanctification?

It is God making sinners holy in heart and conduct.  
(John 17:17; Ephesians 2:10; 4:22-24; Philippians 2:12-13; 1 Thessalonians 5:23)

46. For whom did Christ obey and suffer?

For the world and especially for those whom the Father gave Him.  
(John 3:16; Isaiah 53:8; Matthew 1:21; John 10:11, 15, 16, 26-29; 17:9; Hebrews 2:13)

47. What kind of life did Christ live on earth?

A life of perfect obedience to God and His law.  
(Matthew 5:17; Romans 10:4; 1 Peter 2:21, 22)

48. What kind of death did Christ die?

The painful and shameful death of the cross.  
(Psalm 22; Isaiah 53; The Gospels—Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John)

95. Can any person keep these Ten Commandments perfectly?

**5<sup>th</sup> – 6<sup>th</sup> Grade:**

Bible Reading:

Proverbs, Gospel of John, and 1 John

Catechism:

24. What offices does Christ execute as the Redeemer?

Christ, as the Redeemer, executes the offices of a Prophet, Priest, and King.  
(Psalm 2:6; Isaiah 9:6-7; Matthew 21:5; Acts 3:21-22; Hebrews 5:5-7; 7:25)

25. How does Christ execute the office of a prophet?

Christ executes the office of a prophet in revealing to His people, by His Word and Spirit, the will of God for their salvation.

(John 1:18; 14:26; 20:31; 1 Peter 1:10-12)

26. How does Christ execute the office of a priest?

Christ executes the office of a priest, in His once offering up of Himself a sacrifice for the sins of His people to satisfy divine justice, and to reconcile them to God, and making continual intercession for them.

(Romans 5:10; Hebrews 2:17; 7:24-25; 9:14, 28)

27. How does Christ execute the office of a king?

Christ executes the office of a king in calling His church out of the world to be a people for Himself, and in ruling and defending it; subduing, saving, preserving and blessing His elect; and in restraining, conquering and taking vengeance on all His and their enemies.

(Psalm 110:2-3; Isaiah 32:1-2; 33:22; 63:9; Matthew 16:18; Acts 5:31; 15:14-16; 1 Corinthians 15:25; Ephesians 1:22; 4:11-12; 2 Thessalonians 1:8-9; 1 Peter 2:9-10; Revelation 2:10; 22:12)

28. What did Christ’s humiliation consist of?

Christ’s humiliation consisted in His being born, and that in a low condition, made under the law, undergoing the miseries of this life, the wrath of God and the cursed death of the cross; in being buried and continuing under the power of death temporarily.

(Isaiah 53:2-3; Matthew 27:46; Luke 2:7; 22:44; Acts 2:24-27, 31; 1 Corinthians 15:3-4; Galatians 4:4; Philippians 2:8; Hebrews 12:2-3)
