58. Why is Christ a prophet?

Because He teaches us the will of God.

(Deuteronomy 18:15, 18; John 1:18; 4:25; 14:23, 24; 1 John 5:20)

59. Why is Christ a priest?

Because He died for our sins and prays to God for us.

(Psalm 110:4; 1 Timothy 2:5, 6; Hebrews 4:14-16; 7:24, 25; 1 John 2:1, 2)

60. Why is Christ a king?

Because He rules over us and defends us.

(Psalm 2:6-9; Matthew 28:18-20; Ephesians 1:19-23; Colossians 1:13, 18; Revelation 15:3, 4)

61. Why do you need Christ as a prophet?

Because I am ignorant.

(Job 11:7; Matthew 11:25-27; John 6:67, 69; 17:25, 26; 1 Corinthians 2:14-16; 2 Corinthians 4:3-6)

62. Why do you need Christ as a priest?

Because I am guilty.

(Proverbs 20:9; Ecclesiastes 7:20; Romans 3:19-23; Hebrews 10:14, 27, 28; 1 John 1:8, 9)

Bible Reading:

Proverbs, Gospel of John, and 1 John

Catechism:

37. What are the benefits in this life that flow from justification, adoption, and sanctification?

The benefits in this life that flow from justification, adoption, and sanctification are assurance of God’s love, peace of conscience, joy in the Holy Spirit, increase of grace and perseverance to the end. (Proverbs 4:18; Romans 5:1-2, 5; 14:17; 1 Peter 1:5)

38. What benefits do believers receive from Christ at death?

The souls of believers are, at their death, made perfect in holiness, and do immediately pass into glory; and their bodies, being still united to Christ, rest in their graves until the resurrection. (Job 19:26-27; Isaiah 57:2; Luke 23:4; 2 Corinthians 5:1, 6, 8; Philippians 1:23; 1 Thessalonians 4:14, 16; Hebrews 12:23)

39. What will be done to the wicked at their death?

The souls of the wicked are, at their death, cast into the torments of hell, and their bodies lie in their graves until the resurrection and judgment of the great day. (Luke 16:23-24; John 5:28-29; Acts 24:15; 2 Peter 2:9)

40. What benefits do believers receive from Christ at the resurrection?

At the resurrection, believers being raised up in glory, shall be openly acknowledged and acquitted in the day of judgment, and made perfectly blessed in the full enjoyment of God to all eternity. (Matthew 10:32; 25:23; 1 Corinthians 13:12; 15:42-43; Philippians 3:21; 1 Thessalonians 4:17-18; 1 John 3:2)

41. What will be done to the wicked at the day of judgment?

At the day of judgment, the wicked being raised to dishonor, will be sentenced to the unspeakable torments of body and soul in hell with the devil and his angels for all eternity. (Daniel 12:2; Matthew 13:49-50; 25:41, 46; John 5:28-29; 2 Thessalonians 1:8-9; Revelation 14:10-11).
