- The collapse of the faithful city (21a)
  - o Past and present contrasted: justice replaced by murder (21b)
    - Metaphor: values turned to dross (22)
      - The corrupt rulers (23)
      - The divine Sovereign (24)
    - Metaphor: dross purged (25)
  - o Past and future identified: justice restored in true judges (26a)
- The restoration of the faithful city (26b)
- A1Judgment threatened (24–25a)
  - Restoration: the restored city (25b–26)
  - o Restoration: the redeemed Zion (27)
    - Redemption consonant with (divine) justice
    - Repentance consonant with (divine) righteousness
- Judgment threatened (28–31) (
  - o Its moral ground in rebellion and sin (28a)
  - Its relational ground in abandonment of the Lord (28b)
  - o Its religious ground (29–31)
    - The personal harvest reaped from false religion (29)
    - The self-destructiveness of false religion (30–31)

  - o The undated future (2a)
  - o Supreme exaltation (2bc)
  - o Universal inflow (2d) B
- Recognition: Zion the center of world-wide revelation (3)
  - Nationalism set aside and recognition of the God of Jacob (3a)
  - o Pre-commitment to learn from the Lord and to walk in his ways (3b)
  - o The reality of revelation in Zion (3c) C
- Blessing: Zion the center of world-wide peace

- o Divine authority imposed (4a)
- o International response: the transformation of weapons (4b)
- o The end of war whether in act or intent (4c)
