Jehovah-Jireh (God will provide)

And Isaac said to his father Abraham, "My father!" And he said, "Here I am, my son." He said, "Behold, the fire and the wood, but where is the lamb for a burnt offering?" Abraham said, "God will provide for himself the lamb for a burnt offering, my son." So they went both of them together. Genesis 22:7-8



Throughout Abraham's life God we see God testing him again and again to prove what is really in him. this is important— because God was not just trying to take Abraham somewhere, he was trying to make Abraham into someone.

And so, in Genesis 22, we see Abraham go through another test, this one by far the most difficult he's ever faced.

By Genesis 22, Abraham has had his miracle baby.

They call him "Isaac,"—which means "son of laughter."

The Ultimate Test

When Isaac was 15, God asked Abraham to offer up Isaac as a sacrifice. He said, "Take your son, your only son Isaac, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah, and offer him there as a burnt offering on one of the mountains of which I shall tell you."

Genesis 22:2

Why would God ask Abraham to sacrifice his son?

The offering of the firstborn in the Old Testament symbolized the debt man owed to God. With the knife suspended in the air:

He said, "Do not lay your hand on the boy or do anything to him, for now I know that you fear God, seeing you have not withheld your son, your only son, from me. Genesis 22:12

Abraham proved himself. He passed the test. He showed that there was nothing he would not trust to God; there was nowhere he would not go with God.

Caught in the Thicket

And Abraham lifted up his eyes and looked, and behold, behind him was a ram, caught in a thicket by his horns. And Abraham went and took the ram and offered it up as a burnt offering instead of his son. Genesis 22:13

Caught-took hold of; fastened onto; lay hold of; possessed; seized or trapped

So Abraham called the name of that place, "The Lord will provide" as it is said to this day, "On the mount of the Lord it shall be provided." Genesis 22:14

| <mark>Jehovah-Jireh:</mark> God will provide!

What you name a place is extremely significant in Hebrew literature, because it encapsulates or summarizes the significance of what happened there. Isn't it interesting that they call this place, "The Lord provides," and not "How Abraham obeyed?"

It means: God will see to it and

- God will see to it that your bills are paid.
- God will see to it that you have a good home to live in.
- God will see to it that you connect to the right people to enter into your destiny.
- God will see to it that you have favor in your workplace.
- God will see that your life has purpose.
