John 3:19-21 (The Message)

“This is the crisis we're in: God-light streamed into the world, but men and women everywhere ran for the darkness. They went for the darkness because they were not really interested in pleasing God. ***Everyone who makes a practice of doing evil, addicted to denial and illusion, hates God-light and won't come near it, fearing a painful exposure. But anyone working and living in truth and reality welcomes God-light so the work can be seen for the God-work it is.***”

John 3:16-18 (The Message)

“This is how much God loved the world: He gave his Son, his one and only Son. And this is why: so that no one need be destroyed; by believing in him, anyone can have a whole and lasting life. God didn't go to all the trouble of sending his Son merely to point an accusing finger, telling the world how bad it was. ***He came to help, to put the world right again. Anyone who trusts in him is acquitted; anyone who refuses to trust him has long since been under the death sentence without knowing it. And why? Because of that person's failure to believe in the one-of-a-kind Son of God when introduced to him.***”

Faith & Repentance:

None is righteous, no, not one... for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God... For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord... if you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For with the heart one believes and is justified, and with the mouth one confesses and is saved... For everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved... For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life... And there is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved.

Please also use this as a time of reflection, application, and prayer.

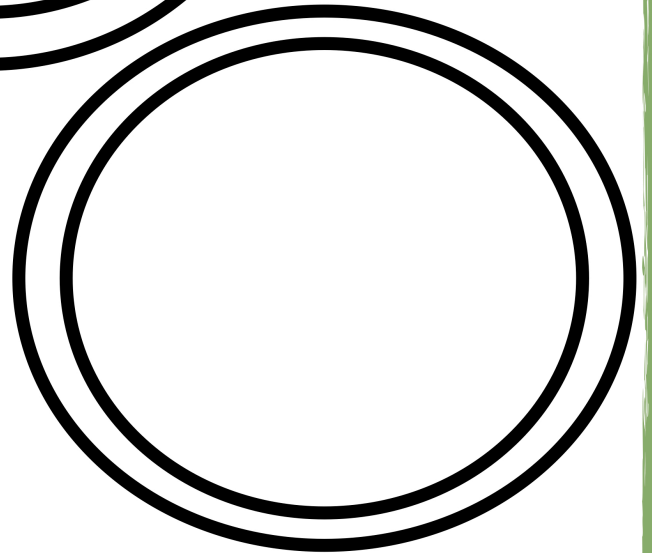
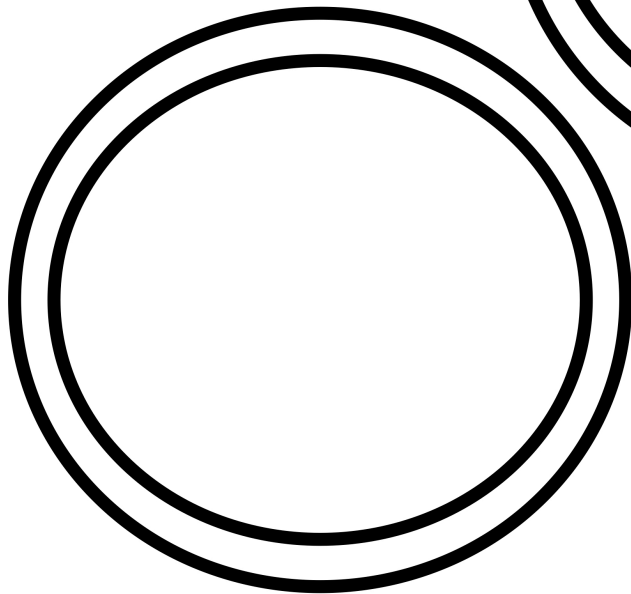
Baptism

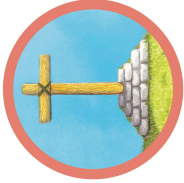

STORY

Triumphal entry

SCRIPTURE

Matthew 21:1-11

MAIN IDEA

Jesus is the King!

AT HOME

- Help your child to understand the word “king.”
- Keep reminding your child that Jesus is King. Jesus is in charge (e.g., “I don’t know if it will rain today. Jesus is King of the rain”).
- Make a long list of things that Jesus is King of (e.g., Jesus is King of the clouds... sun...mommies...).

PRAY

- Praise Jesus for being the King!
- Tell Jesus that He is the King of _____.
- Ask Jesus to be King of you.




Just Believe
