

If you are a Christian and haven't been baptized, please talk with an elder. We would be honored to baptize you.



SCRIPTURE

John 12:1-8

MAIN IDEA

All we have is for Jesus.

AT HOME

- Show your child that you love Jesus (e.g., "I am going to read my Bible because I love Jesus. I want to be with Him"). Be sure your child understands that your good works come from a heart that loves Jesus.
- Sprinkle your speech with phrases like, "I love you, Jesus. We love Jesus. I want to do the best job I can for Jesus. I want to sing a song for Jesus."

- Praise Jesus for being good, kind, and strong.
- Tell Jesus you love Him.
- Tell Jesus everything you have is for Him.




All We Have Is For Jesus
