REFLECTION

"But do not forget this. At first it is natural for a baby to take its mother's milk without knowing its mother. It is equally natural for us to see the man who helps us without seeing Christ behind him. But we must not remain babies. We must go on to recognize the real Giver. It is madness not to. ASSURANCE OF PARDON

Romans 5:8-9



SCRIPTURE

MAIN IDEA

Jesus loves me.

AT HOME

- Show your child a picture of Jesus and the children from a picture book. Talk about Jesus' love. For example, "Jesus loves this girl. Jesus loves this boy. And Jesus loves you."
- Play a "Who loves you?" game with your child. Help your child list the people who love him. Make sure your child understands that Jesus loves him most. For example, "Who loves you?" [Daddy] "Yes!" End with, "Jesus loves you most." In time, you should be able to ask the question, "Who loves you most?"


PRAY
