TURNING THANKSGIVING INTO THANKSLIVING

There is no other sin quite like the sin of ingratitude. Shakespeare said, "How sharper than a serpent's tooth it is to have a thankless child." The blind poet Milton said that a person with an ungrateful spirit only has one vice, because all of the rest of his vices are virtues compared to ingratitude. We have much for which to be grateful to God, but many people are grumbly hateful rather than humbly grateful.

If we're truly thankful, it should show in our lives, and the best way to translate our thanksgiving into thanksliving is to offer to God "the sacrifices of thanksgiving" (Psalm 107:22). In I Peter 2:4 we are told "to offer up spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ." The Bible mentions five spiritual sacrifices that we are to offer.

- 1. OUR PERSON. "I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that you present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God, which is your reasonable service" (Rom. 12:1). I am to offer myself "by the mercies of God. "I give my body to Him because He gave His body for me." The word "present" is a word that describes a man volunteering for the army, so I offer the sacrifice of my body voluntarily.
- 2. OUR PRAISE. "Therefore by Him let us continually offer the sacrifice of praise to God, that is, the fruit of our lips, giving thanks to His name" (Heb. 13:15). According to Psalm 69:30-31, our praise and thanksgiving "shall please the Lord better than an ox or bull." That means that God had rather have your praise than your material gifts. In those days an ox and a bull were valuable possessions, and to offer them to God would be comparable to offering a Mercedes or a Rolls Royce today. Both Hebrews 13:15 and Psalm 34:1 tell us to praise God "continually." You don't come to church to praise the Lord. You are to bring your praise with you to church. You continue in church the praise that you have commenced beforehand. The reason some people do such a poor job of praising God corporately in church is that they have not been praising Him privately.
- **3. OUR PRAYER.** Psalm 141:2 says that your prayer is to be offered to God as incense, the lifting of your hands as the evening sacrifice. Incense is the aroma of perfume ascending in smoke as it is burned upon the altar.

According to Revelation 5:8, that incense is the prayers of the saints going up to God. In the ancient tabernacle the golden altar of incense was located right in front of a curtain, behind which was the Holy of Holies, where the shekinah glory of God dwelt. Morning and evening the priest would offer the incense upon the altar, and there would be communion with the Lord. We can lift our hands and pray, and it is like sweet perfume offered to God.

- **4. OUR POSSESSIONS.** "But do not forget to do good and to share, for with such sacrifices God is well pleased" (Heb. 13:16). In Philippians 4:8 Paul spoke of the giving of material possessions as "a sweet-smelling aroma, an acceptable sacrifice, well pleasing to God." Did you know that your giving shows what you really think of God? Malachi 1:8 describes the evil of some people who offer blind, sick, or lame animals as sacrifices to the Lord. Instead of honoring God with the first-fruits, they were giving God the rejects and the left-overs. Then the prophet sarcastically suggests that they offer those same animals to their governor and see if he would be pleased. We offer to God things we wouldn't give to one another as Christmas or birthday presents.
- **5. OUR PURITY.** Psalm 51:17 declares, "The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit, a broken and a contrite heart—these, O God, You will not despise." David had sinned grievously against God, but it was not his badness that broke his heart. According to Psalm 51:1, it was God's goodness. How can we sin against the one who loved us to the extent that He suffered, bled and died for us? Sometimes we sit in the church pew on Sunday mornings, haughty and unbroken, acting like we are doing God a favor because we are there. Our attitude should be one of brokenness and humility, bowing down before God and offering Him tears of repentance, purity of life and the sacrifice of thanksgiving.

Talk is cheap, and our expression of gratitude to God ought to go beyond words to daily actions.

This is one of the most rewarding service projects we do as we literally help match kids with the presents they will receive under the tree. Without this effort many wouldn't get anything at all and it is always a blessing to see the relief on a parents face as they receive a gift and food for the children for Christmas. After OCC is complete we will place donation bins around the church where you will be able to drop-off a new donated toy for a needy child. Rest assured, you will bring joy to a child somewhere in our community this Christmas. I so enjoy giving our students different opportunities to serve in and out of our community as I believe this is what we are called to do as the hands and feet of Christ.

Just a reminder, we will not be doing our monthly Feed the Homeless service projects during November or December since our assigned weekend falls on the holidays but we do plan to continue to make and deliver blankets and hygiene kits so the homeless' needs are met during this time.
