


Message from Brother M.R.

There is Christmas music playing in the rooms, and popcorn popping in the halls. Faces of people I have never seen before who have come from near and far are gathering around the BBQ grill on the front lawn. Two small children are here with their mother bringing their shoeboxes and the story of when they received those very boxes while in an orphanage. Adopted, they now live here and are sending those same boxes they once received to another child somewhere who's life will be changed as theirs was. A wonderful couple stands in line to ask for some help with their boxes. They have been committed for many years to the project and this year they began packing their boxes in July. It took them until now to get the 504 boxes ready to deliver. A young girl has 16 boxes with her today. It was her birthday and she had ask for everyone at her party to bring \$7.00 to cover the cost of shipping a shoebox as they made gifts for others on her birthday. Oh yes it is starting to look a lot like Christmas, even if Thanksgiving is still two days away. Everywhere I look the spirit of the season is being displayed and I am blessed to be a part of it.

This spirit that drives all the activity should not pass simply because of a day on the calendar. The reason for the season is just as real the rest of the year as it is today. We as Christians have reason to celebrate everyday that we live with and for Him! God is good and worthy of our worship and praise. Not just at Christmas but all year long. So as for me, I want to hold on to the Spirit of Christmas as long as I can. The Good News of Great joy is real and relevant everyday that God gives us to live on this Earth. We also look forward to seeing some of our older students who will return for the holidays, some from college, and also Amy Giles and James Valfre from their military training, and I know you will join me in welcoming them home. Finally, we look forward into next year, as a couple of big events are just over the horizon. Our students and singles will go skiing in Winterplace, West Virginia (Feb. 7th-9th) and then we will host the community wide True Love Waits night here at Lakewood on Wednesday, February 12th. We expect 300+ students to come so we will need lots of volunteers, and there will be more details to come shortly on ways you can volunteer and be involved. 


