

Somewhere along the way, the Federal Courts and the Supreme Court have misinterpreted the U. S. constitution. How could all 50 states be wrong? America's founders did not intend that there be a separation of God and state, as shown by the fact that all 50 states acknowledge God in their constitutions. Fortythree states have references to God in the preamble of their constitutions, while the remaining seven refer to God in their religious freedom provisions. To print all 50 statements would require too much space, but if you're interested in reading

As an example, here is the statement in the preamble of Alabama's constitution, written in 1901: "We the people of the State of Alabama, invoking the favor and guidance of Almighty God, do ordain and establish the following Constitution..."

One of the original Supreme Court justices was James Wilson, appointed by George Washington in 1789. He was one of only six of the Founding Fathers who signed both the Declaration if Independence and the Constitution. He wrote, "It should always be remembered that this law, natural or revealed, flows from the same divine source; it is the law of God.... Human law must rest its authority, ultimately, upon the authority of that law, which is divine."

The Founders of our nation meant for judges to be constitutional constructionists, above the whims of public opinion that politicize the courts. In other words, the original intent of the Constitution would remain firm and unchanging. Unfortunately, over the years judges began "interpreting" the constitution in a manner that conformed to the current political agenda, and the courts became politicized. It is undeniable that elected officials appoint judges who reflect their own political views. The result is that the interpretation of the Constitution today is far from the understanding of our

Founders who wrote it.

The "Father of the Constitution," James Madison, in 1811 appointed Joseph Story to the Supreme Court. Justice Story was only 32 years old at the time, and he remains the youngest Supreme Court justice ever to serve. This man

fifteen servants from LBC will all be first-timers in Romania, though many are veterans of other mission trips, we all will get to experience something new together. As we make our final preparations please pray for our group of over 30 who will leave July 14th to go further the gospel work to children, adults, gypsies, and mission churches in Romania. Thank you to all who made this possible, thank you for eating an ice cream or an after church lunch, thank you for answering a support letter, thank you for buying Cokes, thank you for donating yard sale items, thank you for buying a Christmas tree, thank you for baking a cake/pie, thank you for buying/wearing our t-shirts, thank you for praying for us, but most of all thank you for your faithfulness to spread the gospel! saw the danger of judges yielding to political and public pressure to the extent that they strayed from a strict interpretation of the Constitution. Here is what he wrote: "The truth is, that, even with the most secure tenure of office, during good behavior, the danger is not, that the judges will be too firm in resisting public opinion, and in defence of private rights or public liberties, but, that they will be ready to yield themselves to the passions, and politics, and prejudices of the day.

In this day of political correctness and fear of offending anyone, it's apparent that Justice Story's warning went unheeded. This is the most critical time in the history of our nation, and the next president will appoint several Supreme Court justices, not to mention numerous federal judges. If the trend continues, we will have judges who tinker with the Constitution to make it say what the people and the politicians want, instead of what the Founding Fathers meant.

Every Supreme Court sessions opens with the proclamation, "God save the United States and this Honorable Court." Let's pray that God does exactly that.
