A Message from Dr. Jerry Horner

Do you love mystery stories? If you do, then I invite you to come to a new series of Bible studies that I will teach beginning February 15 at 6:30 p.m. This series of seven lessons is a study of mystery stories that Jesus told, and they are full of instructions that will give you a deeper understanding of your relationship with God and what He has in store for you.

I assure you that I'm not making up the idea that Jesus told mystery stories, because that's exactly what He called them in Matthew 13:11. What did He mean? First, let's notice how He told the stories. In Matthew 13:13, He explained that He spoke in parables (see v. 3). The word translated "parable" comes from a verb that means "to lay

alongside." Think of our word parallel, which comes from the same word. A parallel is two lines lying alongside each other, and a parable is a method of teaching that lays one truth alongside another truth, just like the parallel. It was the Lord's favorite way of teaching. He would first give a truth in the natural world, and then He would make an application to the spiritual world. Or as a little girl once explained, "A parable is an earthly story with a heavenly meaning." In Matthew 13 Jesus told seven stories, and He explained to His disciples in verse 11 that He was teaching in parables to help them to understand the mysteries of the kingdom of heaven.

Today we define a mystery as something impossible or at least difficult to understand or explain, so it remains an unsolved problem or secret. The biblical word has the same meaning, but with one exception, and that is that the mystery has been revealed to those who receive it. Let me explain. A mystery in the Bible is a spiritual truth that could never be known by human wisdom, by human discernment, by human logic, or by human computation. In fact, it would always remain unknown unless God chose to reveal it by divine revelation through the Holy Spirit.

A liberal philosophy professor at a certain college asked the students in one of his classes if any of them believed the Bible. One bold young Christian stood up and said, "Yes, Sir, I believe the Bible." Whereupon, the professor began in a malevolent way to humiliate the student and to ridicule the Bible. He declared, "I've read the entire Bible through, and it's just a bundle of confusion that makes no sense at all to me." The student, emboldened by the Holy Spirit, responded, "Sir, I mean no disrespect to you, but you see, the Bible is God's love letter to His children. If you have read it and you didn't understand it, it's because you've been reading somebody else's mail."

Paul stated in 1 Corinthians 2:14-15 that spiritual things can be understood only by spiritual people, those who are enlightened by the Holy Spirit. The things of God are mysteries that you can know only as the Holy Spirit reveals them to you. Those who refuse to lay their intellectual pride in the dust can never know them, because God has hidden them from the wise and the prudent and has revealed them to babes (Matt. 11:25; see 1 Cor. 2:6-14).

In our studies we will discover why Jesus chose to speak in parables and learn the meaning of the parables of the Kingdom. The principles of interpretation that we learn may be applied to all the parables. If you are serious about becoming a better student of the Bible and growing in discipleship, then I invite you to join us.

As you read these words, I am in Cambodia as part of a three-week teaching and preaching mission there and in Singapore and Indonesia. Please pray for this mission and for your brothers and sisters in Southeast Asia.



A Message from Andrew Spires


