A Message from Dr. Jerry Horner

We have entered a new year, and if you are like I am, you make resolutions that go in one year and out the other. We determine that we are going to do or not do this or the other, and at the end of the year we look back and see that to some degree we have failed to keep our resolution. But that doesn't mean that we should not resolve again, because God is the God of beginning again, a new start, a second chance. He tells us in Ephesians 5:15-17: "See then that you walk circumspectly, not as fools but as wise, redeeming the time, because the days are evil. Therefore do not be unwise, but understand what the will of the Lord is."

In the New Testament, two Greek words are translated "time." One is the word chronos, from which our word "chronology" comes. This word simply means a space of time, such as so many hours, minutes, or seconds. However, the word used here is kairos, which also speaks of the passing of time, but in the sense of an opportunity. You will see this meaning clearly in Galatians 6:10, which tells us, "As



we have opportunity, let us do good to all." So the passage in Ephesians tells us that we need to see time not just as something that is passing, but as an incredible opportunity. When you redeem time, what you are really redeeming is opportunity. You are maximizing your time.

Ephesians 5:14 describes some people who have been chloroformed by these evil days and need to be jolted awake. There is a day of opportunity that we dare not let pass by. God is the creator of time, and He has given us

every day as a gift. Time is not something we own; we are only the stewards of the time that God has given us. Therefore, we are accountable to Him for what we did with every day that He gave us. There are 24 hours in the day, 1440 minutes in the day, and 86,000 seconds in the day, and every one of them is a precious gift from God. How I use every minute is up to me. Sometimes it seems that we never have enough time, but we have as much time as any other person on earth. The difference between people is how they use the time that God has given them.

This passage instructs us to live carefully, "because the days are evil." According to Psalm 118:24, we are to rejoice in this day that God has made. There are two other days that can steal your joy from today. One is yesterday and the other is tomorrow. Unlike Paul's testimony about forgetting things of the past, some people live in yesterday. They cannot forget past guilt, past glory, past grief, or past grudges, so the load they carry from yesterday takes the joy out of today. Other people are consumed with anticipating tomorrow. They either look forward to what's going to happen or worry about what might happen. Such people need to have a thorough understanding of what Jesus said in Matthew 6:34.

Time is a present opportunity. Yesterday is a canceled check; tomorrow is just a promissory note. Today is the only cash you have. Yesterday is only a dream; tomorrow is just a vision, but each day that you live well makes yesterday a dream of happiness and tomorrow a vision of hope.

Time is a strange commodity. You can't save it; you can't borrow it; you can't loan it; you can't leave it; you can't take it; you can't give it. All you can do is use it or lose it. You can call time out in a football game, but you can't call time out in life. You can store your money in the bank, but you can't put your time in the bank. You can add another cup of water to the soup and make it go farther, but there is no way that you can stretch time. Time is also a very valuable commodity. To waste it is to waste life, because time is the stuff out of which life is made. A person who is killing time is not killing time; he is killing himself.

Let me give you four words that will help you to redeem your time in 2016:

PRAYER. Begin each day with prayer. A woodchopper is not wasting his time when he sharpens his axe, and neither is one who is seeking God's direction.

PRIORITY. It's an insult to God to say you don't have enough time. If you don't have enough time, you are doing something that God did not intend for you to do. Most of the choices we make every day are not between good and bad; they are choices between good and best.

PROMPTNESS. Procrastination and disobedience are just different shades of the same sin. Sin is not just merely doing wrong; it is failing to do what you ought to do.

POWER. Most of us talk about "will power" as though it all depends on us. Here is a good and simple definition of will power: you supply the will and God will supply the power. Ephesians 5:17 tells us to be filled with the Spirit. Maybe instead of learning to work harder, we need to work with more power.

We are into a new year, and every minute of it is a passing opportunity. What do you intend to do with it? When are you going to do it? Stop saying, "If I had the time." You do have the time, or else God would not have given the task.
