


North American Mission Board Annie Armstrong Easter Offering 2014 Week of Prayer March 2-9 Goal \$70 Million

<u>The Ball-Mason Jars are back</u>!- make sure and pick up your free missions jar from the welcome desk or the church office and start saving your change to help with our summer mission efforts, and don't' forget the large missions offering jug on stage. Jars should be returned no later than **Sunday, May 25**<sup>th</sup> for counting. Not too long ago an evangelist from India came to this country, eager to meet some of the spiritual giants and leaders that he had heard so much about. He was particularly interested in one pastor, known even in India for his powerful sermons. There were thousands of people present on the Sunday that the evangelist attended the church led by this famous pastor. Everything was just as he expected. The music led by the choir and the orchestra was outstanding, and the preaching was inspiring. But the man from India was particularly captivated by an announcement the pastor made about the midweek prayer meeting. He declared that there were some burdens heavy on his heart, and he urged people to come and pray. The Indian evangelist was so moved that he was determined to attend the prayer meeting.

On Wednesday night he brought several assumptions with him when he showed up at the chapel where the prayer meeting was to be held. The most basic assumption was that prayer meetings are the most essential part of the effective ministry of a church. In India, as well as in many other countries, especially those in which Christians are persecuted, the prayer meeting is the central part of the church's life. Everyone attends, and the meetings usually last long into the night, and it is not unusual for Christians to arise daily long before sunrise to meet together for prayer. In many places, particularly in Korea, I have often been awakened well before dawn by the tramp of hundreds of feet on the street below as believers hurried to attend prayer meeting before going on to work.

The brother from India expected a large crowd, and the chapel seated only 500 people, so he went early to get a seat. However, when he arrived at the chapel, he was surprised to find only a few people present. A few more people drifted in, but instead of songs of worship and prayers, there was only chitchat about news, weather and sports. Seven people were present when the leader, who was not the pastor, arrived to begin the meeting. He offered a few devotional thoughts from the Bible and gave a brief prayer. The meeting was over, and as the few attendees left, the Indian preacher sat in stunned silence, full of questions. Is this all? Aren't they going to stay and wait on God? Where was the praise? Where were the tears and the cries and the entreaties for guidance and power? Where was the list of the sick and the poor and others in need? What about the burdens that the pastor said he was carrying? Aren't we going to plead for the miraculous power of God?

Unfortunately, the Indian evangelist found the same pattern repeated in mid-week prayer meetings all over the USA. There were announcements, a couple of songs and a brief homily from the Bible, but few prayers, and that was in the churches that actually had prayer meetings in their schedules. Perhaps we should call those meetings "spare" meetings instead of prayer meetings!

You may have heard it said that a Christian's life is no better than his prayer life. We could also say that a church's ministry is effective only in proportion to its corporate prayer life. Many church members, if they pray at all, evidently have the idea that the church prayer meeting is unnecessary, as long as individuals are praying in their own homes on their own time. What they fail to realize is that most of what the Bible says about prayer is addressed to groups meeting together to pray. The young church in Jerusalem "all joined together constantly in prayer," and when they were threatened with persecution, they raised "their voices together in prayer to God" for Him to show His power against their enemies (Acts 1:14; 4:23-31). It was in a congregational prayer meeting in Antioch that the church's missionary movement was launched (Acts 13:1-3). When Paul urged the churches to pray for him, he was asking the people to pray as congregations, not only as mere individuals.

Quoting the words of Jesus in Matthew 18:19, Jonathan Edwards called upon the churches of eighteenth-century New England, to look at congregational prayer as a kind of concert. Jesus said, "If two of you agree on earth concerning anything that they ask, it will be done for them by My Father in heaven." The word translated "agree" is the word from which we get our word *symphony*. When the churches accepted Edwards' proposal that they pray in concerted agreement for revival, there was a great awakening that resulted in the salvation of millions of people.

I call upon the members of Lakewood Baptist Church, and all the churches of this area, to join in a concert of prayer in which we pray for the revival of our nation and the advancement of the Kingdom of God. On Wednesday nights I am beginning a teaching of "The Faith Factor." Over the next few weeks, we will study biblical teachings on the meaning of faith, how to live by faith, how to grow in faith, and how to experience faith in every daily situation. Each week we will apply those teachings in our prayer time, which will be the focus of the meetings. I challenge you to be a part of this exciting adventure.


