A Message from Dr. Jerry Horner

When you read this issue of Connections, I will be in the first few days of a preaching and teaching mission in Southeast Asia that will take me to Singapore, Indonesia, Thailand, Vietnam, Cambodia, and Malaysia. On Good Friday and Easter Sunday, I will preach the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus in Thailand, a country held in the grips of superstitious idolatry. A major sight at the departure terminal of Bangkok's airport is one of the largest and most grotesque idols imaginable. However, the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ is penetrating this darkness, and multitudes of people, particularly the youth, are turning from idols to serve the living and true God.

I greatly look forward to preaching the truth concerning Jesus at this particular time and place, because He is "declared to be the Son of God with power according to the Spirit of holiness, by the resurrection from the dead" (Rom. 1:4). Why didn't God use creation as a demonstration of His power? Wouldn't the creative power that formed the universe be an even greater power than resurrection power? No, because there was no opposing force in creation. When God decided to create, He just spoke the planets and the stars into existence, without any opposition from the enemy. But at the cross the devil did his worst. In the resurrection God did His best. And the Bible tells us that the same power that that raised Jesus from the dead is at work in us (Eph. 1:19-20). Whatever the devil can do when he has done his worst in your life, remember that God has resurrection power. Just as He raised Jesus out of the grips of Satan and freed Him from the bonds of death, He is able to liberate you from the worst the devil can do in your life. Most of us have known grief at the death of a loved one. Grief is a reality, and the Bible doesn't tell us not to grieve. But it does tell us not to grieve as people who don't know Christ, because they have no hope. The resurrection of Jesus assures us that death does not have dominion, and it is God's pledge to us of our own resurrection. Christ has taken the sting out of sin. He has taken the gloom out of the grave. He has taken the dread out of death, and He has given us a hope that is steadfast and sure.

There is an ancient fable about a spider and a lion. The spider was envious of the lion and hated him as he paraded around the jungle as the king of the beasts. One day the spider saw the lion go into a cave to take a nap. Here was his opportunity to imprison the lion. So while the lion was asleep, the spider began to work furiously, spinning across the mouth of the cave the thickest and strongest web he had ever spun. When he finished, he was certain that the lion was now his prisoner and his slave. Soon, however, the lion awoke from his nap, stretched and yawned contentedly, shook the dust from his mane, and then let out a mighty roar that echoed throughout the jungle. Then he walked out of the cave without even noticing that the spider's web was there.

Satan wove a web of hate and unbelief across the tomb of Jesus, but the Lion of Judah rose victoriously from the dead, completely unrestrained by the devil's flimsy web. Jesus is alive, and He lives in my heart!


At 10:45 the kidz will reassemble at the side entrances to the sanctuary for the 11:00 Worship Service Palm Parade.


