A Message from Andrew Spires

LEAD PASTOR

As we approach Christmastime, we as believers may find it hard to understand why so many others don't view Jesus the way we do. Many people just believe Jesus was a good and moral teacher. Do you understand why this is actually a very dangerous view? Many of you have heard what C.S. Lewis once said and wrote about Jesus; "A man who was merely a man and said the sort of things Jesus said would not be a great moral teacher. He would either be a lunatic—on the level with the man who says he is a poached egg—or else He would be the Devil of Hell. You must make your choice. Either this man was, and is, the Son of God, or else a madman or something worse. You can shut Him up for a fool, you can spit at Him and kill Him as a demon or you can fall at His feet and call Him Lord and God, but let us not come with any patronizing nonsense about His being a great human teacher. He has not left that open to us. He did not intend to." In simplest terms, Lewis said that Jesus was either a lunatic, a liar, or He is Lord, as it has been often simplified.

Consider the story of the Magi or wise men found in Matthew 2. We are told that the wise men traveled from the East, possibly Persia, Arabia, or further as they followed what we have come to call the star of Bethlehem. However, there are some common misconceptions about the wise men. First, the bible doesn't say that there three exactly. We assume, because of the gifts they brought (gold, frankincense, and myrrh) that there were three men. By early tradition, their names were Gaspar, Melchior, and Balthazar. In the mid-1800s a man named John Henry Hopkins Jr. wrote the song; "We Three Kings" permanently cementing the idea that there were three kings who came to visit Jesus. So, in truth, we do not know how many there were or if they had any kingly titles. Second, though we might say that they followed the star of Bethlehem, they did not come to a stable in Bethlehem, but to a house in Jerusalem (Matt. 2:1, 11). They did not arrive just as Jesus was born, but much later, likely within Jesus' first two years of life, since that is the infanticide order that Herod gave, to kill all male babies two years and younger after being fooled by the wise men (Matt. 2:16). Third, these Magi just didn't happen upon a star but were likely learned astrologers (the Greek meaning of the word Magi) who apparently studied the heavens. They may actually have been royal advisors or wise men who served kings, but we don't know for sure.


No matter the uncertainty of all the facts, isn't it amazing that foreigners

sought out the child born the King of Jews? They literally dropped all that they were doing and went to see the baby king. They were fully convinced by the star (and possibly by prophetic Scriptures) that God was at work and so they came to worship Him. What an odd thing to do; to fall down and worship a baby! I wonder if these Magi were shocked to see Jesus at home with blue-collar parents and not living in some royal palace. Nonetheless, before Jesus was capable of any lordship claim of His own, people came at great expense, from great distances, bearing costly gifts, to recognize

Him as Lord and King. We might find it hard to believe that people today could miss who Jesus really is, yet some of His earliest visitors certainly recognized His true nature. Jesus was no lunatic, He is not a liar, but He is indeed Lord! In fact, He is the King of kings and Lord of lords! Matthew 2:10 says; "When they saw the star, they were overjoyed." I pray this is your response when you consider the true meaning of Christmas. That you are overjoyed to fall down and worship the King! God bless.




