As I began to write this note I am once again taken back by the way time has been flying since I arrived here at Lakewood. Let me share a few observations and see if you too are surprised by the fact that I am now working off of my third annual calendar. It's true, I came to preach the revival March 10<sup>th</sup> 2013 and my present calendar reads 2015. Just the other day we were talking about how it would soon be Christmas and as you read this Christmas has come and gone. I was speaking with a friend last week and he asked how it was down here in Alabama, and I shared that my days seem like hours here. A week only takes a day and a month seems less time than a year used to be. In my heart I still feel like we have just arrived at Lakewood but the reality is it has been nearly two years. If I had been asked when I arrived where I thought we would be in two years I can't imagine that my answer would be nearly as good as it actually is. The sweet spirit and unity that we have been blessed with has made the ministry here a real joy. You see time really does fly when you are having fun.

One of the realities that becomes more self evident each year is that a year is not very much time. Oh when I was a child and you told me I had to wait until the end of the week I felt and believed that that was a very long time. Then I can recall times like my last six months in the Marine Corps and how I thought that time would never come to an end. Then I recall Seminary and how I felt about having to spend 4 long years there. But just a few short weeks ago I celebrated the fact that my wife has stood by me for 20 years now. That has to be true because my daughter just turned 17 years old. Now I look ahead and say in ten years I will be turning 65 years old and I realize that I had better start getting ready as 10 years is not very far to go after the distance I have already come.

As I look back on my life and the many cycles it has gone through to arrive here I recall being a kid in school. I recall being a marine and living in the barracks of 29 Palms California. I recall the days of solitude in the mountains where I seldom knew or cared what day it was. Those years passed like a summers day. I remember the funny look the nurse gave me when I tried to pick up Elizabeth from the hospital just after she was born. I had no idea how to put in a car seat and I had it all wrong. I was clueless as to how much my world was about to change. From each of those days I have life long memories that always return when I stop to look back at where I have been. Some people like to call those the good old days, but I remember them a little differently. As a child I found myself born 200 years too late to really be the person I wanted to be. In the Marines I discovered a side of myself that I have never admired nor dreamed of being. All alone in the silence of God's creation I found my heart longing to share those experiences that are forever mine alone. Like the rivers that start in those very mountains my life ran head long from one state to another never realizing where I was going, or if I would know when I got there.

March 10<sup>th</sup> 2013 was a birthday I will always remember as I turned 53 years old that day. It was the first day of the joint revival with Central and Lakewood here in Phenix City. It does feel as though that was just a few days ago in my mind but my calendar tells me differently. As I wake up every morning I pinch myself to see that I am not dreaming. I go out of my way to drive by the church in my travels and imagine I have my lifelong friends and family in the car so I can see their faces as we clear the trees to see the facility. In my imagination it is always at night when the flood lights give such contrast to the magnificent buildings. I know they won't believe it because I don't. I have driven by the great churches all my ministry life and wondered about the men who get to park in the pastors parking spot. I really don't care about being close to the door as I like to walk around the place when I first arrive, but I just love parking in the pastors parking spot. I feel like at any time someone will come over and ask me why I'm there but they never do. You know as I look back on these days at Lakewood I know exactly what I will say. Friends, those were the good old days!

# To know Him and make Him known

Many people are entering the new year with fear and anxiety instead of expectation of great things. God wants us to be free from all worry, and He gives us the formula for fearlessness. Hebrews 13:5-6 exhorts us to live our lives without covetousness and to be content in His promise never to leave or forsake us. Because of that promise, we can say with full confidence, "The Lord is my helper. I will not fear. What can man do to me?" There are four thoughts in these verses that will enable us to face this new year without fear.

First, there is the contentment of God's provision. Our lifestyle is to be characterized by contentment with things that we have instead of coveting what we don't have. Discontentment is a disease that takes away your joy and peace. Contentment is not getting what you want, but wanting what you already have. Contentment will make a poor person rich, while discontentment will make a rich person poor. The word translated "covetousness" literally means "to have more." Someone once asked John D. Rockefeller how much money it would take to satisfy a person. His answer was, "Just a little more." Jesus taught in Luke 12:15 that material things can never bring contentment, simply because they can never satisfy the deepest needs of the heart. Ecclesiastes 5:10 tells us that the person who loves silver will never be satisfied with silver. Either he can't get enough of it, or when he gets it he finds that it doesn't meet his need. The word "content" means "self-contained," indicating that contentment doesn't depend on outward circumstances. Paul wrote from a Roman prison that he had learned to be content in all situations, whether in plenty or in poverty (Phil. 4:11). His secret was that he could "do all things through Christ who strengthens me" (Phil. 4:13), which literally means, "through Christ who is pouring His life into me." If the source of your satisfaction and security is in Christ, you can face the new year without fear.

Next, there is the companionship of God's presence. Sometimes we are fearful because we think we are facing something we don't understand, and we'll have to face it alone. But God promises never to "leave" nor "forsake" you. Actually, there are five negatives in that promise. Literally God says, "I will never, no, not ever, no never leave you nor forsake you." Worry is a form of heathenism. It's acting as though God doesn't exist, or if He does, He doesn't care. But God's word to us is that He will never desert us and that His presence will see us through.

Then there is the confidence of His promise. A promise is no better than the one who makes it, and this is the promise of Almighty God. The pronoun "He" is most emphatic, underscoring the fact that this is a promise that God Himself gave, not just an angel or a prophet or an apostle. When you say, "I don't have the strength for next year," the omnipotent God answers, "I'll never leave you nor forsake you." When you say, "I'm afraid of going through another year alone," the omnipresent God says, "I'll never leave you nor forsake you." When you say, "I don't know what to do," the omniscient God says, "I'll never leave you nor forsake you." This is the word of a faithful God.


Finally, there is the comfort of His protection. Because of God's promise, we can say with all boldness, "The Lord is my helper; I will not fear. What can man do to me?" Put verses 5 and 6 together: "He Himself has said.... so we may boldly say." Whatever heartaches or difficulties you may face, you can have the assurance of God's help. You may not know what the year 2015 will bring, but you can boldly say, "The Lord is my helper."



He describes the dynamics and discipline of righteousness, the priorities of the Kingdom, characteristics of Kingdom citizens, and relationships of Kingdom citizens. He shows us how to be happy, how to pray, how to give and how to receive, how to believe, and how to live a stress-free life. In this study you will be enlightened, shocked, challenged, and ultimately you will grow as a follower of Jesus Christ.






# SANCTITY OF LIFE SUNDAY JANUARY 18, 2015


Our annual Baby Bottle Boomerang begins on Sunday, January 4th, 2015 for Sound Choices Pregnancy Clinic.
