| Read Daniel 2:1–18. | |
| The king became anxious after suffering from nightmares. He demanded an interpretation for his dreams but wanted to be sure that the wise men were truly capable. His request was unreasonable and caused fear to rise among many of the wise men in the kingdom. In verses 10–11, what did the wise men say about the king's request? What does their statement reveal about their capabilities? | |
| In verses 14–16, how did Daniel respond to the request and decree of the king? How does the king's response to Daniel's request differ from that of the other wise men? | |
| The king decided to kill all of the wise men because of their inability to help him—but Daniel and his friends were granted permission to have more time without any consequences. In what ways do you think Daniel's influence played a part in the favor he was shown? What does Daniel's approval for more time show us about how God can work in critical times? | |
| When Daniel was offered extra time to interpret the king's dream, he immediately went to pray and seek God for answers. In what ways has it been easy or difficult for you to go to God with your issues first, as opposed to your friends, family, or phone? | |
| What could it look like for you to address God immediately when dealing with difficult situations? | |
| Despite Daniel's prominence, wisdom, and skill, he knew that God was his only chance to get out of such a tense situation. In what ways have you relied on your talent to get you through a particular situation? In the future, what are some ways you could involve God in the things you're naturally good at? | |

Memorize: Memorize Sadie's statement: "We must begin to treat our areas of influence as opportunities to advance God's reputation to the world, not our own reputation. We are not the heroes of the story."
