R. Read Isaiah 6:1-7 aloud.


Q. How is the holiness of God described in Isaiah 6:1-7? Look for keywords that describe His holiness and what sets Him apart.

R. On page 125, Chip says, "When we begin to see God for who He really is instead of who we make Him out to be, the experience starts upward and then moves inward. We see God and then we see ourselves. When we get a high view of God, we stop comparing ourselves to others because we understand how much we fail to measure up to Him. Instead of trying to figure out how close we can get to sin without actually sinning, we begin trying to figure out how we can get as close to His purity as possible."



R. Keeping the previous quote in mind, read Galatians 5:16-26 aloud.
