# READ

2 Corinthians 5:1-10 | ESV

1 For we know that if the tent that is our earthly home is destroyed, we have a building from God, a house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens.

2 For in this tent we groan, longing to put on our heavenly dwelling,

3 if indeed by putting it on we may not be found naked.

4 For while we are still in this tent, we groan, being burdened—not that we would be unclothed, but that we would be further clothed, so that what is mortal may be swallowed up by life.

5 He who has prepared us for this very thing is God, who has given us the Spirit as a guarantee.

6 So we are always of good courage. We know that while we are at home in the body we are away from the Lord,

7 for we walk by faith, not by sight.

8 Yes, we are of good courage, and we would rather be away from the body and at home with the Lord.

9 So whether we are at home or away, we make it our aim to please him.

10 For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each one may receive what is due for what he has done in the body, whether good or evil.



# DISCUSS

Lead your group through the following discussion questions. Help them thoughtfully reflect and respond to God's direction.

1 | Consider home renovations for just a moment. The pre-existing house, though flawed and broken, is taken to a new level of beauty and function. This isn't done by a new coat of paint or by new appliances. Instead, this is done by allowing every square inch of the old home to be swallowed up by the right and proper materials to make it all that it should be. This doesn't happen instantaneously but it happens over a period of weeks or months.

Similarly, the Christian's body is being made new by being swallowed up by God and His power over the course of the believer's life. Not only are our bodies being made new but so are our affections and desires. In what ways has the Holy Spirit transformed your character and conduct? Where are areas of your life that you desire for the Spirit to continue working?

2 | Verse 5 shares the comfort that the Holy Spirit is the guarantee of God's promises to the Christian, namely that God is at work in the Christian's life and has made a new dwelling place and body for His people. Consider a current circumstance that is fraught with emotional or physical pain. How does the truth and promise of verse 5 impact your situation?

3 | In verse 10, we are introduced to the bema (judgement) seat of Christ. The idea that is conveyed here is that God will reward us for the worthwhile things we did in His name. Have you considered reward to be a wrong motivation to serve God in the past? Why or why not? How would you convey this truth to someone that says reward is an improper motivation?

4 | Pastor Kevin gave three concluding questions in his sermon.

- 1) Have you really come to a place in your life in which you've trusted Jesus as Savior & Lord?
- 2) Can you say your deepest affections are with Christ?
- 3) While we wait for His return, how can knowing the location of your ultimate "home" affect your attitude and activity during difficult days?

Spend just a moment considering these questions and share why one particular question hits home **AND** what are you going to do in order to answer that question in light of today's passage.
