## Corporate Communion: First Sunday of the New Year

The Bible's teaching on the Lord's Supper (Communion) is found in 1 Corinthians 11:17-34 & invites participation for believers who are walking in fellowship with the Lord. All those who have personal faith in Jesus Christ are invited to partake of the Lord's Supper.

Biblically, there are two types of people who should not take communion: those who are not saved by Christ or those who are living in unconfessed sin.

What's important is that the participants are born-again believers walking in fellowship with their Lord & with each other.


Communion is a time of remembrance (Luke 22:19) & a time of reflection. Before partaking of communion, each believer should personally examine his or her heart & motives (1 Corinthians 11:28).

The word communion is related to the word union. Communion is the result of a union with Christ; the sharing of Christ-like thoughts, feelings, & experiences. Sharing in the death & burial of the Son of God is a foundational part of salvation (Romans 6:3-5), & that death is symbolized in the ordinance of communion.

According to the Bible, those who take communion must be humble, born again, free of unconfessed sin, & living in obedience to God. For the converted, repentant sinner, the Lord's Table is a welcome place of knowing God's provision & resting in His grace.

Friday dinner is provided by Friendship Baptist Church & Saturday breakfast is at the hotel.


The church will do our best to provide the transportation for the entire event. Register with the provided QR code.

## **Tithes & Offerings**

As we turn our attention to worship through giving, let us consider what King Solomon says in Proverbs 3:9-10, <sup>9</sup> Honor the Lord with your wealth, with the first-fruits of all your crops; <sup>10</sup> then your barns will be filled to overflowing, and your vats will brim over with new wine.

You might wonder, "What's a 'first-fruit' & what's that got to do with us in 2024?" This made sense to people living in an agricultural society. But for us it takes some explaining.

The "first-fruits" were the very first part of the crops that were harvested each season. Throughout Scripture God calls His people to prioritize Him by giving the first & best to Him.

For people who depended on the harvest for the food they fed their families, this was a big deal. If you have people in your household that depend on your income to eat, you know this is huge.

So, why did God require people to give Him their first & best?

It is not that God needed their first-fruits. God is not needy. He has everything. It is all His. Rather, God knows that we need to give.

Back in the day when people's wellbeing depended upon them planting & harvesting, giving God the first & best of their crops was a concrete way of prioritizing Him by giving.

It is the same with us today. Trusting God with a portion of our income is good. But when we choose to give God the first of our income, something changes. Giving becomes worship & dependence on Him in a new way.

Let us commit to prioritizing God in every way this year, including worshiping Him through giving. Whether you give a dollar, a tenth of your income, or beyond, we encourage you to begin your giving by prioritizing God. Give Him your first, & He will become first in your life.
