"Now, therefore, you are no longer strangers and foreigners, but fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God." Ephesians 2:19

## Four things that connect us as members:

#### **Our Salvation**

"Just as He chose us in Him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and without blame before Him in love, having predestined us to adoption as sons by Jesus Christ to Himself, according to the good pleasure of His will." Ephesians 1:4-5

Problem – sin has separated us from God, "for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God." Romans 3:23

Solution – God sent His Son Jesus Christ to die for our sin, "For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord." Romans 6:23; "But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us." Romans 5:8

#### What does God want me to do?

1. Admit that your sin separates you from God

"If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness." 1 John 1:9

2. Believe that Jesus died for your sin

"That if you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved." Romans 10:9

"Nor is there salvation in any other, for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved." Acts 4:12

- Accept Gods free gift of salvation through Jesus Christ Ephesians 2:8,9
  "For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God, not of works, lest anyone should boast." Ephesians 2:8-9
- 4. Invite Jesus Christ to come into and direct your life

"But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, to those who believe in His name: who were born, not of blood, nor of the will of the flesh, nor of the will of man, but of God." John 1:12,13

"God, I know that I am a sinner. I know that my sins separate me from you. I want to thank you for sending Jesus Christ to die for my sin. I believe in Christ, His death, burial and resurrection that cancels my sin debt. I accept Jesus Christ as my personal Savior. Thank you for saving me, in the name of Jesus."

This is the way Jesus was baptized – Matthew 3:16

## Who and when should a person be baptized?

A person should want to be baptized soon after accepting Jesus Christ – Acts 2:41

## Importance of the Lord's Supper

- To remember the death of Jesus Christ 1 Corinthians 11:24-25
- To show our symbol of our faith in Jesus Christ 1 Corinthians 11:26
- To allow us an opportunity of self-examination 1 Corinthians 11:27

Note: Following Christ in believers' baptism and partaking in the Lord's Supper does not secure ones relationship with God but is an outward expression of an inward commitment to God.

## **Our Strategy**

We desire for every member to be involved with a consistent Lifegroup. We cannot live out our lives in a spiritual vacuum but rather learn to be interdependent on the community of believers.

We have the ultimate goal to strengthen the gifts of every member and bring them to a point that they can re-produce themselves into another life.

Lifepoint practices congregational type government by voting on, officers of the church; calling of a senior pastor, changes to the church constitution and by-laws, a yearly budget and other important issues.

## The History of Lifepoint

In the fall of 2008 a small nucleolus of six adult believers met in the Sienna Estates Clubhouse for the purpose of starting a new church. For the first five weeks the met on Saturday nights to learn of this purpose and philosophy of this new church. During September of 2008 this small group began to meet on Sundays to forge the new path for Lifepoint, they had thirteen at their first Sunday meeting.

The founder pastor was Mike Brinson which moved to Northwest Arkansas in the summer of 2008 for the singular purpose of starting a new church. Pastor Mike had previous ministry experience from growing up in a pastor's home, attending Bible College for his undergraduate and graduate degree and from working on staff for eight years in Springfield, Missouri at Cherry Street Baptist Church.

During the fall of 2008 God began to bless this new church with more committed believers and a move was going to become a necessity. During the month of November the church worked to remodel a storefront off the main highway through Centerton. That December Lifepoint moved to Beckendale Plaza and celebrated with twenty four in attendance.

It became evident in January of 2009 that God was continuing to bless the ministry of Lifepoint and further expansion was going to be needed to adequately minister to the children. Again they stepped out by faith to rent another portion of the Beckendale Plaza and on the first Sunday in March opened up Kidpoint for pre-school and elementary age children. God again blessed on that Sunday with forty-one in attendance.

It was now time for Lifepoint to give a big public push and a Grand Opening celebration was set on the calendar for Easter Sunday, April 12, 2009. Even in the midst of one of the wettest Aprils on record God moved in the heart of 75 individuals to attend the Grand Opening celebration.

Lifepoint looks forward to the opportunity to make disciples and start other new churches.

## Why is church membership so important?

At Lifepoint we ask you to commit to membership because of the value Christ placed on the church. In Ephesians 5:25 Paul states that Christ loved the church and gave His life for it. We live in a culture that bucks commitment but we believe that commitment builds character. This commitment defines who we can count on.
