CELL GROUP DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. Easter is a celebration of God's power over death by raising Jesus from the dead. But we do not typically think of Easter as a reminder of our resurrection with Christ. Why is that?
2. For many of us, a "personal relationship with Christ" means that we can pray to the resurrected Lord who loves us and cares for us. Colossians 3:1-4 talks about another aspect of our relationship with the Lord. Describe what that is.
3. There are two action items that are given to us in Colossians 3:1-4: "seek the things above" and "set your mind on the things above." Discuss what this would look like and how we can do it? How is this similar to or different from what Jesus instructed us in the Sermon on the Mount: "seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness" (Matt 6:33)?
4. It seems hard to imagine myself as having "died with Christ" and having been "raised with him"? What helps you to grasp this? Romans 6:11 may help with part of this.
5. Being raised with Christ means that we have access to his power to deal with sinful patterns of behavior in our lives (Colossians 3:5-11) and to develop virtues that are pleasing to God (3:12-15). How can we tap into this resurrection power to do this? What are some of the ways I need to change in light of this passage?
