Question: *What is forbidden in the second commandment?*

Answer: *The second commandment forbiddeth the worshiping of God by images, or any other way not appointed in His word.*

Monday: Scripture: Deuteronomy 13:6-18
Key Thought: The second commandment forbids all participation in and toleration of false worship.

Tuesday: Scripture: Exodus 32:1-6
Key Thought: The second commandment forbids the making and using of images in religious worship.

Wednesday: Scripture: Colossians 2:16-23
Key Thought: The second commandment forbids all insistence on outward forms of worship.

Thursday: Scripture: Deuteronomy 4:1-2; 12:28-32
Key Thought: The second commandment forbids adding to or taking away from the worship that God has commanded in His word.

Friday: Scripture: Matthew 22:1-7
Key Thought: The second commandment forbids all laxity in or opposition to the true worship that God has appointed.
