Growth Questions for 6/13 -6/20

1. What insight, principle, or observation from this weekend's message did you find most helpful, eye-opening, troubling?
2. What are some things that people today rely on to claim moral superiority over others?
3. What motivated the Jews' bragging about their relationship with God? What should we as Christians boast in? (1 Cor. 1:29-31; 2 Cor. 10:13-18, 11:30, 12:5-9; Gal. 6:14-15)
4. Read this passage aloud. Substitute "Jews" with "Christians". Substitute "circumcision" with "baptism". Substitute "law" with "Bible". How does this affect your understanding of this passage? Can you think of other things that are analogous to circumcision people might boast or rely upon?
5. What does Paul mean by "circumcision of the heart"? How is one's heart circumcised?

1. In what way did the Jews blaspheme God among the Gentiles? How might this relate to the church today?
2. Can you think of times you were trying to teach someone and thought, "that's good advice... I ought to listen to that"? Are there things you are doing right now that do not reflect well on the name of Christ? Take some time today to deal with those things before God.
3. Is there anything that you are relying on for your moral standing apart from the Gospel? How can you communicate the Gospel to others today and at the same time share how your own moral living is not sufficient to reconcile you to God?
