Reflection Questions: Galatians 6:14

For the message, "What Does It Mean To Boast In The Cross?" given by Pastor John Ferguson at Mercy Hill Church in Bryan/College Station, Texas, on September 11, 2022

These discussion questions are designed primarily to help you apply the message from the Scriptures by helping you think through application to your personal life, your church life, and your city's life. You can use these by yourself for reflection, or with your family or small group for discussion.

INTRODUCTION

Pray. Take a moment to pray asking God to guide you in reflecting upon the Scripture text.

Scripture Text: Galatians 6:14

"Far be it from me to boast in anything except the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ...."

Also, let's reflect on these verses from the Apostle Paul's own life:

- 1 Corinthians 15:9 (c. AD 54): "For <u>I am the least of the apostles</u> and do not even deserve to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God."
- **Ephesians 3:8** (c. **AD 62**): "Although <u>I am the least of all the Lord's people</u>, this grace was given to me: to preach to the Gentiles the boundless riches of Christ...."
- 1 Timothy 1:15 (c. AD 64): "Here is a trust worthy saying that deserves full acceptance: Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners—of whom I am the worst."

A summary of the message: Following Jesus over time should translate into greater and greater levels of appreciation for, rejoicing in, and boasting in the Cross. The message of the Cross is Good News for unbelievers AND believers too!

Bottom Line:

• "Spiritual growth is not about moving on from where we began—the gospel. It's about growing deeper in the gospel. Or rather, getting the gospel deeper into us" (Brian Hedges).

QUESTIONS

- 1. Let's think about how this text applies to our lives as individuals.
 - Is the idea of *boasting in the Cross* something new to you? What kind of questions does it bring to your mind?
 - What do you make of Paul's "downward progression" we see in the above bullet point verses that enabled him to boast about and be obsessed with the Cross?
 - How does boasting in the Cross free us to be be "brutally honest with ourselves and with God," as the writer Jerry Bridges once said?
