
That makes the cross not a sign of death, but a sign of the end of death. A sign of hope, a sign of possibility for every human being.

- Wrote ~ half of the New Testament documents









Boast = καυχάομαι (kauchaomai)

It means to boast in, glory in, trust in, rejoice in, revel in, live for.




The object of our boast or glory fills our horizons, engrosses our attention, and absorbs our time and energy.




Why be obsessed with the Cross of Jesus

The Performance Trap:




The Power of the Gospel for Personal Change

Spiritual growth is not about moving on from where we began-the gospel. It's about growing deeper in the gospel. Or rather, getting the gospel deeper into us.


