








**The New Testament** revolves around a series of events said to have occurred in Palestine between 5BC and AD30. This makes Christianity open—some would say vulnerable....



For his invisible attributes, namely, his eternal power and divine nature, have been clearly perceived, ever since the creation of the world, in the things that have been made. So they are without excuse.






For although they knew God, they did not honor him as God or give thanks to him, but they became futile in their thinking, and their foolish hearts were darkened.






Claiming to be wise, they became fools, and exchanged the glory of the immortal God for images resembling mortal man and birds and animals and creeping things.




Last of all, as to one untimely born, he appeared also to me. For I am the least of the apostles, unworthy to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God.






If Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain and your faith is in vain.... But in fact, Christ has been raised from the dead.





19 And they took him and brought him to the Areopagus, saying, "May we know what this new teaching is that you are presenting? 20 For you bring strange things to our ears. We wish to know therefore what these things mean."





21 Now all the Athenians and the foreigners who lived there would spend their time in nothing except telling or hearing something new.

22 So Paul, standing in the midst of the Areopagus, said, "Men of Athens, I perceive that in every way you are very religious. 23 For as I passed along and observed the objects of your worship, I found also an alter with this inscription, 'To the unknown god'...."

23 What therefore you worship as unknown, this I proclaim to you.

24 The God who made the world and everything in it, being Lord of heaven and earth, does not live in temples made by man, 25 nor is he served by human hands, as though he needed anything, since he himself gives to all mankind life and breath and everything.

26 And he made from one man every nation of mankind to live on all the face of the earth, having determined the allotted periods and the boundaries of their dwelling place, 27 that they should seek God, and perhaps feel their way toward him and find him, yet actually he is not far from each of us...,

28 for 'In him we live and move and have our being'; even as some of your own poets have said, 'For we are indeed his offspring.'
