






## THE GOSPELOF LUKE GOOD NEWS OF GREAT JOY FOR ALL PEOPLE





1 There were some present at that very time who told him about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had mingled with their sacrifices.




2 And he answered them, "Do you think that these Galileans were worse sinners than all the other Galileans, because they suffered in this way?"

As he passed by, he saw a man blind from birth. And his disciples asked him, "Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?" Jesus answered, "It was not that this man sinned, or his parents, but that the works of God might be displayed in him."


3 No I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all likewise perish.



The same way? That's the key. Jesus isn't talking about what happens to people after they die. Many have read this passage and supposed that it was a warning about perishing in hell after death, but that is clearly wrong.



In line with the warnings he has issued several times already, and will continue to issue right up to his own crucifixion, Jesus is making it clear that those who refuse his summons to change direction,



to abandon the crazy flight into national rebellion against Rome, will suffer the consequences. Those who take the sword will perish with the sword.

4 Or those eighteen on whom the tower in Siloam fell and killed them: do you think they were worse offenders than all the others who lived in Jerusalem?

5 No I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all likewise perish.




Those who take the sword will perish with the sword. Or if not the sword, they will be crushed as the siege brings them crashing down....




**Building accidents** happen; but if the Jerusalemites continue to refuse God's kingdomcall to repent, to turn from their present agendas, then those who escape Roman swords will find the very walls collapsing on top of them as the enemy closes in.

6 And he told this parable: "A man had a fig tree planted in his vineyard, and he came seeking fruit on it and found none. 7 And he came to the vinedresser, 'Look, for three years now I have come seeking fruit on this fig tree, and I find none. Cut it down. Why should it use up the ground?'

8 And he answered him, 'Sir, let it alone this year also, until I dig around it and put on manure. 9 Then if it should bear fruit next year, well and good; but if not, you can cut it down.'



This parable is about God's patience with his people Israel. They had every opportunity to come to Christ and bear good fruit.



For nearly three years, Jesus had been healing them and teaching them to follow God. Alas, they were bearing so little fruit. Most rejected Jesus.




Pilate said to them, "Then what shall I do with Jesus who is called Christ?" They all said, "Let him be crucified!" And he said, "Why? What evil has he done?" But they shouted all the more, "Let him be crucified!"

So when Pilate saw that he was gaining nothing, but rather that a riot was beginning, he took water and washed his hands before the crowd, saying, "I am innocent of this man's blood; see to it yourselves."


And all the people answered, "His blood be on us and on our children!" Then he released for them Barabbas, and having scourged Jesus, delivered him to be crucified.






Most rejected Jesus. Yet in his mercy, God would give them one final opportunity. Jesus would die on the cross; he would be raised from the grave; his gospel would be preached in Israel.



Thus there was still time for people to repent and bear good spiritual fruit through faith in Jesus Christ. Nevertheless, the window of opportunity would not stay open forever.



This was the last chance for the people of that generation. If they did not repent, they would perish, as many of them did. Not many years later Jerusalem was besieged, the temple destroyed, and Israel was scattered.




## **Important Point!**

When we see dictators killing and towers tragically falling, let us remember that life is short, and we too will one day step off the stage of this world to meet our Maker.


