I think of Christianity as a culture. It has produced 2000 years of artifacts: literature, music, art, ethics, architecture, and (yes) beliefs. But cultures evolve, and Christianity will have to adapt in order to survive in the modern era. Many of those paths will be dead ends....



I believe one of the newer religious paths could be a 'belief-less' Christianity. In this 'sect,' one is not required to believe things.... But what about belief in God? Can a belief-less Christianity really survive if God isn't in the picture? Can you even call that Christianity anymore? In theory, yes....



Someone quipped that my congregation is BYOG: Bring Your Own God. I use that and invite people to 'bring their own God' — or none at all. While the symbol 'God' is part of our cultural tradition, you can take it or leave it or redefine it to your liking. That permission to be theological do-it-yourselfers is at the heart of belief-less Christianity.




GEEKING OUT ON GREEK

"Strive" = Greek: agonizethe (ἀγωνίζεσθε)

"to endeavor with strenuous zeal"



The door to the kingdom of God is standing open before you. Focus your attention and energy on entering the narrow door now.



Jesus refuses to allow this to be a matter of curiosity but makes it a matter of urgency.




I am the door. If anyone enters by me, he will be saved....

It's too exclusive.


I believe any sincerely good person can find salvation.

Very.





If you don't have to believe in Jesus to find God, then good works are enough. And if good works are enough, then God accepts people through performance.



Key Thought

If folks are asked, "If heaven exists, would you want to go there?", many would undoubtedly say yes.

But if you were to say, "Jesus says you must turn from living for yourself and turn to God," many will respond, "Uh, no thanks. I prefer my own DIY spirituality."

26 Then you will begin to say, 'We ate and drank in your presence, and you taught in our streets.' 27 But he will say to you, 'I tell you, I do not know where you are from. Depart from me, all you workers of evil!'



Familiarity with Jesus is not the same as having a place in the kingdom of God.

28 In that place there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth, when you see Abraham and Isaac and Jacob and all the prophets in the kingdom of God, but you yourselves cast out."

29 And people will come from the east and the west, and from the north and the south, and recline at table in the kingdom of God. 30 And behold, some are last who will be first, and some are first who will be last.

Lord, are there few who will be saved?








Important Question




I will rise and go to Jesus He will save me from my sin By the riches of His merit There is joy and life in Him






Here is a trustworthy saying that deserves full acceptance: Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners — of whom I am the worst.




Whoever does not believe God has made him a liar, because he has not believed in the testimony that God has borne concerning his Son.


