The Gospel of Luke 19:28-44

28 And when he had said these things, he went on ahead, going up to Jerusalem.

Pray for the peace of Jerusalem. They will prosper that love her. — Psalm 122:6 —

29 When he drew near to Behphage and Bethany, at the mount that is called Olivet, he sent two of the disciples, 30 saying, "Go into the village in front of you, where on entering you will find a **colt** tied, on which no one has ever sat. Untie it and bring it here.

31 If anyone asks you, "Why are you untying it?' you shall say, "The Lord has need of it." 32 So those who were sent away found it just as he had told them. 33 And as they were untying the colt, its owners said to them, "Why are you untying the colt?" 34 And they said, "The Lord has need of it."

35 And they brought it to Jesus, and throwing their cloaks on the colt, they sat Jesus on it. And as he road along, they spread their cloaks on the road.







43 For the days will come upon you, when your enemies will set up a barricade around you and surround you and hem you in on every side 44 and tear you down to the ground, you and your children within you....



And they will not leave one stone upon another in you because you did not know the time of your visitation.




No other city endured such miseries...

Now at the feast [Pilate] used to release for them one prisoner for whom they asked. And among the rebels in prison, who had committed murder in the insurrection, there was a man called **Barabbas.**

...And he answered them, saying, "Do you want me to release for you the King of the Jews?" For he perceived that it was out of envy that the chief priests had delivered him up.

But the chief priests stirred up the crowd to have him release for them Barabbas instead.



And Pilate again said to them, "Then what shall I do with the man you call the King of the Jews?" And they cried out again, "Crucify him." And Pilate said to them, "Why? What evil has he done?" But they shouted all the more, "Crucify him."

So Pilate, wishing to satisfy the crowd, released for them Barabbas, and having scourged Jesus, he delivered him to be crucified.





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
The Unpredictable Impact of the Inescapable Jesus






