
UNION with CHRIST

Union with Christ means that you are in Christ and Christ is in you.


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
Union with Christ is not just some doctrine to be understood intellectually, but a reality to be lived into experientially.




In Christ we are secure and have everything we need with the peace of God as a garrison patrolling our hearts and his glorious riches laid open to meet our needs.

In Christ we have a whole new way of looking at life, seeing his hand and his sovereign will in all things....


