





Paul bypasses the walking metaphor that he uses so often to portray the pattern of behavior that befits our faith, replacing walk with the citizen-laden verb... [which means] to maintain a standard of conduct befitting a citizen, to behave in a way that enhances the reputation of one's city.

The only thing that matters is that you continue to live as good citizens in a manner worthy of the gospel of the Messiah.



New Testament with Psalms and Proverbs

Philippi was a Roman colony, a "little Rome," and as such it was a hotbed of patriotism and rife with worship of the Empire and Emperor.

In Philippi, aka "little Rome," what was your manner of lifeyour citizenship-supposed to be worthy of?



Residents of the Roman colony of Philippi were to live out their citizenship in a manner worthy of "the eternal city" of Rome.

But our citizenship is in heaven, and from it we await a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ.

Hey, I'm already aware of how much my life falls short in this area. How can I ever live a life worthy of the gospel?

Important Point

The same grace of Jesus that forgives us is also the same grace of Jesus that empowers us to live for Him.

Key Thought

Religion is very good at helping you create carefully edited versions of yourself to show the world, but Jesus has come to change us from the inside out.

Key Thought #1

Work as though the Lord Jesus is your Ultimate Boss

"Work...as for the Lord and not men..."

"It is the Lord you are serving."

Implication #2

Because of the Gospel, futility does not have the final word.

Three responses to Jesus

1. Outright Rejection

In his hometown & from the Samaritans

2. Conditional Acceptance

"I will follow, but first...."

3. All in with Jesus



The one thing I would stress is this: your public life must match up to the gospel of the King.
