
- 1 Have mercy on me, O God, according to your steadfast love; according to your abundant mercy blot out my transgressions.

- 8 Let me hear joy and gladness; let the bones you have broken rejoice.











In the end the heart longs not for any of God's gifts, but for God himself. To see him and know him and be in his presence is the soul's final feast.
