





## WHO ARE WE WORSHIPING, AND HOW?

Jesus sits down at a well, tired from his journey, and He begins to have a conversation with a woman who has come to draw water. In just that simple moment Jesus broke all the social norms of the day. Not only was Jesus speaking as a man to a woman, but He was also a Jew interacting with a Samaritan, this didn't happen! Jews hated Samaritans, and the other way around. But, as always, Jesus isn't concerned with all the things that do not matter, that we so often get caught up in, Jesus is simply concerned about this woman's heart. He will break social norms if He needs to in order to reach her.

After telling this woman that He can offer her living water, she doesn't quite understand. Jesus, of course, is speaking about eternal life, but just like the frail human beings we are, the woman is caught up in the physical, and can't quite get to the spiritual. So, Jesus blows her away by telling her something only God could know, that not only does she not have any husband currently, but that she has had five husbands and is now living with a man who isn't her husband! Busted!

The woman changes the subject, believing Jesus to be a prophet...Listen to how this goes down in John 4:19-26:

"The woman said to him, "Sir, I perceive that you are a prophet. Our fathers worshiped on this mountain, but you say that in Jerusalem is the place where people ought to worship." Jesus said to her, "Woman, believe me, the hour is coming when neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem will you worship the Father. You worship what you do not know; we worship what we know, for salvation is from the Jews. But the hour is coming, and is now here, when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth, for the Father is seeking such people to worship him. God is spirit, and those who worship him must worship in spirit and truth." The woman said to him, "I know that Messiah is coming (he who is called Christ). When he comes, he will tell us all things." Jesus said to her, 'I who speak to you am he.'"

Jesus readily explains to the woman at the well that it is not about location! In so many words He is telling her that it is not about where you worship, but about HOW you worship that matters. Now, this isn't a license to not attend the gathering of the assembly, we need to worship together, the Bible is very clear about that in other areas as well.

However, the point Jesus is trying to make here is that it's not about the building we are worshipping in, the songs we are singing (whether they are contemporary songs on a screen or hymns from a hymnal), how we are dressed, how long the sermon is, who is or is not sitting next to us, or how much money we put in the offering plate when it comes by. IT IS about whether or not when we worship Jesus (and Jesus alone mind you) that we really and truly mean it from the deepest depths of our heart.

We can sing praises at the top of our lungs. We can be seated in pews made of gold linen and the finest building material a church building has ever seen. We can donate up to half our earnings for the year back to the church, and we can hear the most eloquent sermon of our time. But if we don't believe it, and if we don't allow the Word of Life, the Living Water of Christ to penetrate our souls and overflow into loving others as Jesus loved us, it doesn't mean anything.

Listen to how Jesus answers the question in Matthew 22:36-40:

"Teacher, which is the great commandment in the Law?" And he said to him, 'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the great and first commandment. And a second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. On these two commandments depend all the Law and the Prophets.""

Are you loving God with all your heart, soul, and mind? Are you worshipping God, not just on Sunday mornings, but every day, in Spirit and in Truth?
