2 BAD & 2 GOOD

Every person who has ever lived either can serve as a bad example of how to live or a good example of how to live. This is true of individuals in Scripture as well. Either we should follow their example or we should not. It's pretty simple. And speaking simplicity, our topic for this article is pretty simple: the response we have when asked by God to do something. So, we're going to take a look at 2 bad examples from Scripture and 2 good ones. Let's start with the bad to get it out of the road, shall we?

Ever hear of a guy named Moses? He's a pretty popular Old Testament figure, if not THE most popular. He is well known for good reason, because God used him to do some pretty incredible things, but before all that he was an 80 year old shepherd that didn't want to change... Essentially God comes to him and says, "Moses, I want to use you to free my people from slavery in Egypt."

Moses hems and haws around, making all sorts of excuses. Finally he even begs God to find someone else! God doesn't, and eventually Moses would go on to obey. However, we learn from Moses as a bad example, because we know that when God asks us to do something we should do it, not make excuses. How do we know what God wants us to do? We read about it in His Word, the Bible. Has God convicted you of something and you just keep on making excuses?

Ever hear of a guy named Jonah? Yeah, probably, but most of the time it's just for the fact that he was swallowed by a huge fish. But before all that, God simply called this prophet to go and preach to the wicked city of Nineveh. Jonah didn't want to go, but he doesn't even make excuses like Moses. He just runs away! Doesn't even say anything! He pretends like he can get away from God without Him knowing, so he gets on a boat headed for Tarshish. Funny.

A storm rages on the sea and the only thing that'll calm it is Jonah being thrown overboard. So, the sailors throw him over. The sea becomes calm, Jonah is swallowed by a fish and repents and eventually goes on to obey. Even when he obeys though, if you look at Jonah chapter four he's got a pretty bad attitude about it... We learn from Jonah as a bad example, why? Because when God asks us to do something, we shouldn't run away, and we shouldn't whine about it... Is there something God wants you to do, but you know that you have been avoiding God and avoiding doing it forever? Don't be like Jonah, or you're liable to get swallowed by a big fish!

How about a good example? Finally, right? Ever hear of a teenager named Mary? She was called to be the mother of the Son of God, Jesus Himself. An angel appears to her and tells her all this, and she's afraid at first, but who wouldn't be if an angel actually appeared to them??? She is told all these crazy things, that she will carry the Son of God in her womb. That is a pretty important calling. But Mary doesn't make excuses. Mary doesn't run away. She says this in Luke 1:38, "I am the Lord's servant"... Mary simply obeys. No questions, no fighting, no running. Just listening and obeying. Trusting God.

Ever hear of a few fishermen named Peter, Andrew, James, and John? They were some of Jesus' first disciples, and you can read about them in Matthew 4. They are out fishing when Jesus calls them and says, "Come, follow me!" The Bible says that Peter and Andrew went "at once", and that James and John went "immediately". (continued)

Their obedience is instantaneous. They don't ask where they are going, what they will be doing, none of that, they simply go.

Church which two are you? Be honest. When asked to do something for God, are you making excuses or running away like Moses and Jonah? Or are you hopping to it with excitement and tenacity liking Mary, Peter, Andrew, James, and John? Far too often we are too hesitant just like Moses and Jonah. Let's be like those other 5 individuals who got it. When God asks us to do something, let's OBEY.

So, are you obeying? Here's a test, open your Bible and read Ephesians 4:29-32, you'll find out real quick!

Each month our Deacon's Pantry distributes food and some paper products to 15 - 20 families. If you are able to pick up a few non-perishable items


