# GRACE

I love Dietrich Bonhoeffer. He is one of the greatest Christian writers of all time, dare I say, one of the greatest Christians of all time. He is best known for his affiliation in a failed attempt to assassinate Adolf Hitler. Perhaps his best known book is *The Cost of Discipleship*, which is a great book that I must admit I have not finished... However, my favorite book of his, one that I did finish, is called *Life Together*. This book is all about the Church, what it should look like, and how Christians should treat one another. Bonhoeffer is never afraid to be straight up with his audience, here, let me show you...

"Anybody who has once been horrified by the dreadfulness of his own sin that nailed Jesus to the Cross will no longer be horrified by even the rankest sins of a brother....The most experienced psychologist or observer of human nature knows infinitely less of the human heart than the simplest Christian who lives beneath the Cross of Jesus." (Bonhoeffer 118-119). What does this mean? It means that every Christians should lean heavily towards the side of grace. Because we have seen how messed up we are in comparison to Christ, we understand and have mercy and forgiveness for those who need the most forgiveness.

Before we point fingers, call names, and begin gossiping about the terrible, offensive sin that the latest Christian slip-up has committed, we ought not so quickly forget that it was us in that same boat not so long ago. And I don't know about you, but I didn't need someone to tell me one more time how wrong what I did was (I already knew that and had been convicted of it greatly), I needed someone to tell me they understood where I was at because they had been there before. I needed someone to tell me that because of Jesus, my slate could be wiped clean, again. I needed a fellow Christian to look me in the eye and say, "God's not even close to being done with you yet.".

Now that I have been through that myself, several different times actually... Can I now say that I am the person that brings grace to the person hurting, trying so desperately to get out of their sin? Or am I the guy on the sideline, talking about how awful it must be to be that person, going on about how he could fall that far...

Don't forget the story of the woman caught in adultery. The Pharisees were so ready to stone her, and the woman who was caught red-handed stood before the only Person in existence to have the right to throw the stone, but He doesn't, and the men who were so eager to stone her moments before walk away dumbfounded because Jesus called them out. "Let any one of you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her.", Jesus says. One by one they drop their rocks, just as guilty as the woman who they came to stone. Church, it's time to drop your rock, pick up your Bible, and lead the charge with forgiveness, love, mercy, and truth.




