TO AND FROM THE CONGREGATION

As the book of Deuteronomy declares, "Remember the days of old; consider the generations long past" (Deut. 32:7). This coming Friday marks Remembrance Day on which we remember and give thanks for the sacrifice of our Armed Forces in times past and times present, especially for those who paid with their lives to protect the freedoms we enjoy. Let us also remember to pray for peace and for the families who grieve the loss of loved ones in service for this country.

Looming on the horizon is a major milestone for Bill and Alie Vogelzang. They will, the Lord-willing, celebrate their 60th wedding anniversary this week Thursday. Congratulations to you on this very special occasion! The Lord has blessed you richly with the love that you have for each other, and we acknowledge that this love comes from God who has walked together with you faithfully all these years. May He continue walking with you as you go forward from here!

We have recently received some new members into our midst. We welcome Ed and Cisca Jansen and their 3 children - Steven, Jesse, and Leanne - and also Evert and Jannie Otten who all come to us from the Neerlandia-South congregation. May the Lord bless you and make you a blessing in the Barrhead congregation.

Two weeks ago we could hear the sad announcement of the withdrawal of sister Riekje Otten. Some months ago Riekje moved south but never joined her membership to a sister church in the area. By this decision Riekje effectively cut herself off from the love, support, and oversight of the congregation here in Barrhead where she was last a member and by her actions she has set herself outside of any recognised faithful church of Jesus Christ. This fills us with deep sorrow since it is difficult to reconcile with the profession of faith vows she made to remain committed as a living member of Christ's church. It is therefore our prayer that the Lord will heal what has been broken and give Riekje guidance by his Spirit in the way of his will.

We remember those with health concerns among us or in our wider-families. This list is not meant to be comprehensive; certainly some will be missed, especially those who suffer in silence – but this list is given simply so that we might all be aware and up-to-date. Candice Dykstra, the wife of Darren, the son

of Louis and Tena Dykstra, underwent cancer surgery late last week. It appears that the surgery went well and its effect will be assessed when a biopsy is performed. Arlene Zuidema experienced a minor stroke late last month. After spending two days in the hospital she could return home again and is currently on the mend. We hope and pray that this mending may continue. Others such as Jordan Peters (crohn's disease) and Sandy Kobes (chronic pain) and Amy Hoeksema (also chronic pain) continue to battle health struggles of late. For others there are physical ailments or mental ailments or even spiritual ailments. We pray that the Lord will grant strength and relief to all who are suffering in the challenges they face, as they hold onto the hope that God has promised that He will bring renewal and restoration to all things, using even our sufferings for his glory.

This week, from November 8-10, representatives of the CanRC Committee for Contact with Churches in North America (CCCNA) will attend the annual meetings of NAPARC (North American Presbyterian and Reformed Council) in Pompton Plains, New Jersey. Though the alphabet-soup is a mouthful, we nevertheless pray that these meetings and all of its bilateral ecumenical meetings may be of blessing and benefit for all the churches gathered together under the NAPARC tent. As promised, allow me to give a "quick" summary of the ministerial conference Jolene and I could attend from October 25-27 in Sumas, WA. The keynote speaker was Kevin Hoogstad, a Christian counsellor and marriage/family therapist from Hamilton, Ontario. He spoke first on the topic of "Understanding the Teenage Brain" emphasizing the physical development that takes place from age 10 all the way to age 30. Recognizing this, we were made aware of how this impacts the functioning of a teenager's thinking and behaviour and their progress in maturity and responsibility. In the light of many changing cultural influences we must hold onto the truth of Proverbs 22:6 to train a child in the way they should go so that when they are old they will never depart from it. It is important for their growth already from an early age not only to engage with them and to set a good example and pattern of devotion for them, but also to be open to their challenging questions and seek to draw out the long-term impact that every decision has. In his second speech on "Teen Culture" Hoogstad spoke on how to better understand youth culture and how to develop good strategies for connecting with them more intentionally and meaningfully. In a cultural environment where there is great ambivalence among young people toward what

adults have to say, we are to come alongside and practice affirmation. The rise of social media shows that many are looking for constant affirmation. If the church is not where young people find that sincere interest from others, then they often leave and seek it elsewhere. In our world where disloyalty is rampant many avoid attachment. In this context the older generation must model the beauty of loyalty and faithful commitment (in marriage, in family, in church). This will encourage the younger generation to be

active and excited and involved and connected with the church community, which as the Body of Christ is to reflect integration instead of isolation, as we all look out for one another.

We could also hear speeches by Apko Nap on the “(Lost?) Art of Listening” and by Rev. Doug and Karen VandeBurgt on the struggle of depression in the ministry. This issue is undoubtedly complex and it was pointed out that many studies are making the case that depression is a disease of the mind (as opposed to the idea that it is only a lack of motivation or faith). Medical and scientific research has only scratched the surface of what there is to know about brain-related illnesses, and so we must tread carefully. Yet we were shown how important it is for those who struggle with depression and other mental health disorders to see them in the wider-context of suffering which God has revealed as necessary to refine us and lead us to glory. Overall the speeches were very informative and helpful, and the food and fellowship exceptional. I hope I've given you all a small taste of what a good and rejuvenating experience it is each time to be there at this retreat, and am thankful for the opportunity given to attend.

I think I've gone on long enough. Have a blessed Lord's day!
