CRWRF – 2018 THANKSGIVING COLLECTION FOR AIDS RELIEF

Donations received through this year's Thanksgiving collection will be dedicated to AIDS Relief. If you were to search "AIDS" in Google News, you would probably find that there aren't many recent stories from North American news websites. This does not, however, mean that the topic of AIDS is no longer pressing. Every two years since the mid-1980s, an International AIDS Conference has been held with the goal of improving policies and programs to ensure an effective response to this ongoing epidemic. At the 2018 conference in Amsterdam, the concern was expressed that we are in danger of losing control of this epidemic due to 'dangerous complacency'. Although vast strides have been made in prevention and treatment, foreign aid has stagnated. As a result, 37 million people were still living with HIV at the end of 2017 (vs. 35 million who have died of HIV/AIDS since the mid-1980s), and in Africa (where the infection rate is highest) that translates into almost 1 in 25 adults with HIV (4.1%). The focus of the conference was therefore to put the global HIV response back on track.

Various projects funded by CRWRF in Kenya and South Africa are aimed at providing support to both those with HIV/AIDS as well as their caregivers. This support comes in the form of food parcels and medication, but also spiritual care. For example, the Tamu Project in Kenya provides seminars on relationships based on Biblical principles. Families are encouraged to have open and positive communication. This is important in combating the stigma against HIV/AIDS which prevents many people from being tested for HIV, and thereby spreads the infection. In August 2018, CRWRF representatives again witnessed firsthand the effects of HIV/AIDS in South Africa, a country bearing the heaviest burden of the epidemic with over 7 million people living with HIV. It is difficult to find a home that has not been affected in some way. Home-based care projects continue to provide valuable assistance to those who need it the most. We appreciate your prayers and your contributions via this Thanksgiving collection towards our efforts to combat the effects of AIDS and provide spiritual guidance to those affected in Africa.
