

WEEK 4 | WORSHIPPERS
LUKE 10:38-42



We're doing a short mini-series in Luke 9-10. The first 8 chapters of Luke ask the question, "Who is Jesus?" In chapters 9-10 the focus shifts to, "Who are we called to be in light of who he is?"

- 1.) Read Luke 10:38-42. Very simply, what happens in this passage? What do you think is the main point of the passage?
- 2.) Do you resonate more with Mary or Martha? Why?
- 3.) On Sunday Dave reminded us that when we sit at Jesus' feet we learn more about who he is. What steps are you taking (or can you take) to spend time "sitting at Jesus' feet"?
- 4.) The more time we spend with God, we don't just learn about who he is, but also about who we are, and the work we are called to do. Split into groups and summarize what the following verses teach us about who we are and what we are called to be doing: Galatians 2:10, Ephesians 2:10, John 6:28-29, Psalm 37:4, John 15:7.
- 5.) On Sunday Dave suggested that sitting at the feet of Jesus (delighting in him and listening to him) leads to a life of bearing fruit. Sitting at Jesus' feet prepares us to respond to his call in our lives by reorienting our hopes, desires and prayers. Do you sense God calling you to take any new steps of faith to serve him?
- 6.) How can being in community with other believers help you commune with God more deeply?
