Shorter Catechism Question #32: What benefits do they that are effectually called partake of in this life?

Answer. They that are effectually called do in this life partake of justification, adoption, and sanctification, and the several benefits which in this life do either accompany or flow from them.

- Introduction and Background: Jonah was a prophet to the 10 Northern tribes of Israel. Nineveh was an ancient Assyrian city, located on the outskirts of Mosul in modern-day northern Iraq. Joppa was a coastal city on the Mediterranian sea.
 Tarshish was a city in southern Spain 2500 miles from Joppa.
 - A. Genre: Historical narrative or allegory/parable.
 - B. Date: 793-758 B.C.
 - C. Author: Jonah. Although the book makes no direct claim.
