## PRIVATE CONFESSION OF SIN (Silent)

You who have done great things, O God, who is like you? <sup>20</sup>You who have made me see many troubles and calamities will revive me again; from the depths of the earth you will bring me up again. <sup>21</sup>You will increase my greatness and comfort me again. <sup>22</sup>I will also praise you with the harp for your faithfulness, O my God; I will sing praises to you with the lyre, O Holy One of Israel. <sup>23</sup>My lips will shout for joy, when I sing praises to you; my soul also, which you have redeemed. <sup>24</sup>And my tongue will talk of your righteous help all the day long, for they have been put to shame and disappointed who sought to do me hurt."
