History/Science	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Distinguish living and non-living• Understand that each living thing has a specific habitat• Recognize key ideas in text by noticing bold words and call outs• Know what makes a community• Recognize that the world is comprised of many cultures• Have a foundational knowledge of geography and United States history on which further learning can be built
