

North Texas Presbytery Licensure and Ordination Process

This document is intended to provide some direction and guidance on your upcoming exams.

Below you will find helpful information about prepping for the exams.

Based on FAQ:

PERSONAL EXAMS

Christian experience and character -- a questionnaire will be provided.

Views -- a set of questions on such areas as same-sex attraction, racial reconciliation, and other relevant matters.

LICENSURE EXAMS

English Bible -- you will need to know things like outlines of the books of the Bible, major themes in the OT and NT, stories of key personalities, chapter and verse locations for various texts and topics, and places you might go in the Scriptures to teach or counsel people in real life.

Theology -- you will need to know Qs 1-39 of the WSC and how to talk about them in both a pastoral and scholarly way. There's much more to the exams than the WSC (e.g., what is theology and why is it important?), but this is a good place to begin for fundamental knowledge and categories.

BCO -- you will need to know an outline and an overview of the BCO. Hint: The table of contents is your friend.

ORDINATION EXAMS

(The following may only be taken after passing the licensure exams and receiving an approved call for ministry.)

History -- you will need to know key events, dates, personalities, and controversies -- and the same regarding presbyterian history -- including the story of the PCA.

Sacraments -- you will need to know things like different views on the sacraments, proper candidates to receive them, how they ought to be administered, and why. Note: WCF, WLC and SC, and the BCO sections on the sacraments are good places to begin. Don't overlook the relevant biblical texts on the sacraments from OT and NT!

****IMPORTANT****

The written exams vary in size and length. The following times are *rough estimates* based on recent exams. Some candidates take longer than others. BCO usually takes the least time (c. 1.5 hours). English Bible and History usually take the most time (c. 3.5 - 4.5 hours each). Theology and Sacraments (c. 2.5 - 3.5 hours each).

All exams must be proctored. The clerk of TEC will make the exams available to your proctor (a TE or RE of your choice) along with specific instructions about how to take them -- and how your proctor must submit them back to the clerk or chairman.

You may take the exams as you are ready to take them -- *in the order you prefer.*

Note: You must take English Bible, Theology, and BCO *before* taking History or Sacraments. To take those final two exams for ordination the clerk of the TEC must have a copy of the following:

Treat this as a To-Do Check-list -- (1) your approved call, (2) your completed internship, (3) your diplomas (undergrad and grad), (4) your filled out questionnaire on experience and character, (5) transcript showing GREEK and HEBREW, (6) exegetical papers showing proficiency in original languages, and (7) your views document.

To prep for and pass the exams you will need to rely on the ordinary means of grace, remember the promises of God to you, reach out for the power of God in your weakness, and rest in the finished work of Christ for you. *Just as you will need to do every day in your pastoral ministry.*
