A New Year. A New Chapter. The word "new" is important in Scripture. Jeremiah declares that God's mercies are "new" every morning. God speaks of making a "new" covenant with his people. Jesus says his shed blood on the cross is the ratification of this "new" covenant. Through his sacrifice, Jesus has opened a "new and living way" into the presence of God. In Christ we are "new" creations. And God declares at the end of the story, "Behold, I am making all things new."

 4. What questions about creation do you have? Does Genesis 1 answer all the questions that surround creation?
 Why do you think this is?

Communion, or the Lord's Supper, is a symbolic meal for Christians. As part of our preparation to receive the bread and the cup, we profess our hope in Christ out loud. We join with Christians throughout history and the world in making such a profession.

In his Last Supper before crucifixion, Iesus commanded his followers to "do this in remembrance of me." The broken bread and the cup represent Christ's broken body and shed blood for the sake of our salvation. By partaking of the bread and cup, you are proclaiming hope in this salvation and, by faith, enjoy fellowship with Christ (see 1 Cor. 10:16). The bread and cup are signs and seals of God's covenant promises to forgive our sin and make us new in Christ.

PROFESSION OF FAITH

The Nicene Creed

I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth, and of all things visible and invisible.

And in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God, begotten of the Father before all worlds; God of God, Light of Light, very God of very God; begotten, not made, being of one substance with the Father, by whom all things were made.

And I believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church*. I acknowledge one baptism for the remission of sins; and I look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Getting to Know the Shorter Catechism

The Westminster Shorter Catechism is a useful tool for the church. It summarizes essential truths taught in Scripture. Let these brief summaries assist you to delight in God's works and study them more closely. Find other summaries at oakhillspca.com/wsc.

Q. 105. What do we pray for in the fifth petition?

A. In the fifth petition, which is, *And forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors,* we pray that God, for Christ's sake, would freely pardon all our sins; which we are the rather encouraged to ask, because by his grace we are enabled from the heart to forgive others.

Jesus teaches his disciples that it is good and necessary to ask for forgiveness of sins on a regular basis. Scripture gives us at least three reasons why it is good and necessary to make confession of sins.

- 1. Confession of sins is the only means to seek and find forgiveness based on Christ's mercy.

 1 John 1:7 tells us that "the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin." How do we lay hold of that cleansing blood? John continues to explain in verse 9, "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness." Christ died for our sins. There is redemption and reconciliation through his shed blood. But the benefits of the death of Christ are enjoyed only through the expression of faith in Christ that confession of sin espouses.
- 2. Confession of sins is the only means to enjoy fellowship and intimacy with God. "God opposes the proud, but gives grace to the humble" (James 4:6). This posture of humility before God is essential because we have no right to stand before a holy and just God. In his graciousness, God promises to dwell "with him who is of a contrite and lowly spirit" (Is. 57:15). And Jesus promises, "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven" (Matt. 5:3). Confession takes humility. It admits our weakness and inability to do what God calls us to do. God is ready to extend grace to the one who humbles himself in confession.
- 3. Honest confession of sins naturally springs from a heart transformed by grace. This is how the Catechism interprets the logic of Jesus' statement, "forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors." Do we ask for forgiveness because we are forgiving of others? That would make the forgiveness we receive conditioned on our performance of forgiving others. That is not the gospel or the message of Scripture. Rather, we have confidence to confess our sins before a holy and just God because we have seen evidence in our lives and hearts that he has already rescued us and transformed us by his grace. God's saving work through Christ in our lives enables us to be forgiving of others.
